2024 Corvette Gets New Infotainment System With Google Built-In

The <u>2024 Corvette</u> introduces the fifth model year for the mid-engine sports car, bringing with it a few important updates and changes. Among these changes is a new infotainment system that incorporates Google built-in features. The 2024 Corvette is now equipped as standard with the <u>Chevrolet</u> Infotainment 3 Premium audio system with an eight-inch touchscreen. Tagged with <u>RPO code</u> IOK, this system incorporates Google built-in features, but also continues to offer wireless Apple CarPlay and Android Auto integration for

those customers that prefer the smartphone mirroring services.

The new IOK Chevrolet Infotainment 3 Premium audio system with eightinch touchscreen replaces to systems offered previously for the <u>C8 Corvette</u> during the course of the 2020 through 2023 model years. Specifically, these systems that were replaced include (relevant RPO codes listed in parentheses:

- Chevrolet Infotainment 3 Premium audio system with eight-inch touchscreen (IOS)
- Chevrolet Infotainment 3 Premium audio system with connected navigation and eight-inch touchscreen (IOT)

The IOS system was previously included as standard on <u>C8 Corvette Sting-</u> ray 1LT and <u>C8 Corvette Z06</u> 1LZ trim levels, while the IOT system was offered as optional on C8 Corvette Stingray 1LT and C8 Corvette Z06 1LZ trim levels, and included as standard on C8 Corvette Stingray 2LT and 3LT, as well as C8 Corvette Z06 2LZ and 3LZ trim levels.

As *GM Authority* covered previously, <u>OnStar</u>, GM's subscription-based telematics service, now includes a slew of Google Built-in features. These features include Google Maps, Google Assistant, and Google Play. However, users who choose not to pay for an OnStar subscription will <u>lose out on some of these features</u>, and as it turns out, the only features available without a subscription are AM/FM radio, Bluetooth phone and streaming audio connectivity, and Apple CarPlay / Android Auto.



Winterizing Your Corvette

Many of us put our Vettes away during the ice and snowy months. Lots of varied opinions on what to do to winterize your car. Here are a few ideas floating around. Not hard fast rules but just suggestions, you can pick out what works for you.

.I Install a battery tender to maintain a charge. Remember not all battery tenders are created equal. Spend a little more and get one that stops charging once the battery up to appropriate level. A continuous charging can reduce your batteries life.

.2 In the past we have been told to fill your tank to prevent condensation. Now there is a recommendation that you have a quarter of a tank to avoid immersing the fuel sensor for long periods of time. The "tech nerd" for Corvette Magazine doubts the validity of this approach because a tank one fourth full still immerses the fuel sensor. Do your own research and do what you think is meaningful. You may want to consider using a fuel stabilizer. You may want to run your motor for awhile to circulate the stabilizer through the fuel system

4. Some place carpet or special foam pads under the tires to prevent flat spots. Others just turn the car around so that the car is resting on a different spot on the tire. It is not recommended to jack your car up as this can stress the suspension and the shocks. Another approach is to inflate your tires to 45–50 PSI for the winter to avoid flat spots but to be sure to change when start driving.

5. If possible, start the car every week or so and get it up to temperature.

6. Starting in 2014 the Z51 Stingray, Grand Sport, Z06 & ZR1 came standard with racing tires. It is recommended not to let the temperature of your storage area fall below freezing as it will damage the tires.

7. Finally if you drop some of your insurance remember to reinstate the insurance.

Chevrolet Has Raised the Price of All Corvette Models by \$2,000 Effective October 2nd

Chevrolet dealers received a memo overnight from General Motors announcing a \$2,000 price increase across the board on all <u>2024 Corvette models</u>. The effective date for this price increase was October making every new order submitted subject to the price increase. However, dealers who had submitted orders for the 2024 models and have an 1100 status may have price protection. We've seen this before, and having a "price protected" order sometimes means having to fight with your dealer to insure you get it. Here is what the estimated revised pricing looks for all three Corvette models and their trim packages. **Prices include the destination fee of \$1,595:**

GM is Ending 2024 Camaro Production Early, Leaving the C8 Corvette as Chevrolet's Lone Performance Option

The Corvette is going to be the only option under the "Performance" tab on Chevrolet.com sooner than we thought. The Camaro's already "abbreviated" 2024 farewell tour has been cut short by General Motors again.

In June, <u>a pair of special edition sendoffs</u> were announced along with a January 1st end date for the Stingray's iconic little brother. Now, a disappointing report out of <u>GM Authority</u> brings news that the 6th Generation Camaro's already dangerously close finish line has been moved forward.

The new plan will see GM's Lansing Grand River assembly plant piece together its final drop-top Camaro on November 22nd of this year, with the last coupe following suit two weeks later on December 7th

GM Currently Losing \$21M A Day Due To UAW Strike, Says Brokerage Firm

As the United Auto Workers (UAW) labor union continues its strike against the Big Three Detroit automakers, the costs are adding up. Now, financial services firm J.P. Morgan has released a new estimate that GM is currently losing \$21 million every day as a result of the ongoing UAW strike. The UAW began its strike following the expiration of the previous labor contract on September 14th.

Per a report from <u>*Reuters*</u>, J.P. Morgan says that the UAW strike has put a \$191 million drain on GM's operating profit for the third quarter. J.P. Morgan also estimates that Ford's operating profit has taken a \$145 million hit, and is losing \$18 million a day due to the strike.

A recent report from Anderson Economic Group estimates that the UAW strike has cost the U.S. economy nearly <u>\$4 billion so far</u>.

It's estimated that 25,300 UAW members are currently participating in the strike. The union represents 146,000 autoworkers across all three of the Big Detroit makes (GM, Ford, and Stellantis). This is the first time in which the UAW has called for walkouts at all three automakers at the same time.

The UAW is currently employing a targeted strike strategy wherein union members at certain facilities are called on to strike, as opposed to all union members at all facilities, all at once. The targeted strategy is expected to provide UAW negotiators with greater flexibility.

John DeLorean's Daughter Wants to Build a New DeLorean Based on the DeLorean Based on the C8 Corvette



Then there's Classic DMC, run by a Liverpool mechanic named Stephen Wynne who bought the DeLorean name and the original company's parts inventory and factory drawings back in 1995. He's since made his money servicing and reproducing parts for the original 9,000 DMC-12s.

But only one company still has John DeLorean's bloodline as CEO, his daughter Kathryn DeLorean. Now her company – named DeLorean Next Generation Motors (DNG) – is planning a lineup of two DeLorean's, according to an exclusive story by Hagerty."I needed to find a way to build an affordable car for the DeLorean community," Kathryn says. "They'll be heartbroken forever if I don't give them something."

Hence, the upcoming pair of cars – led by the Model JZD at the top with only 42 hand-built units to be produced. For the common folk, there's a less expensive version that will, appropriately enough, be based on a C8 Corvette, fitting since John Z. spent 17 years of his career at General Motors and was even president of Chevrolet from '69 to '72.

That version will replace the Corvette body with a design by DNG, including the iconic gullwing doors, and performance upgrades from aftermarket builders are in the works, too. Automotive designer Angel Guerra, who worked six years for Croatian EV firm Romac and stayed with them after its 2021 merger with Bugatti, has penned some renderings to give an idea what may lie ahead.
