Why Does Oregon have such high prices for gasoline

Oregon, Washington, California and Hawaii have some of the highest prices for gasoline if not the highest in the nation. Some explain this away because Oregon and Washington and so far away from the Gulf Coast which is the hotbed of U.S. oil production. Actually crude oil for Oregon and Washington come mainly from Alaska since the 1970s and is refined in Washington State. Historically Washington States prices have been slightly lower than Oregon but that is now the case currently.

Five major factors tend to make Oregon gas extra pricey.

- Oregon, Washington and Hawaii are not crude oil producers. According to the U.S. Energy Information Administration those states produce zero barrels of crude oil
- Gas has to travel farther to get here. American Petroleum Institute shows a dense network of pipelines across the South and Midwest to cheaply distribute oil and gas from the Gulf Coast, but with much less connectivity to the West Coast.
- The West Coast lacks refinery capacity. This is doubly true for Oregon, which not only produces no crude oil but also operates zero refineries. About 90% of the state's gasoline comes from refineries in the Puget Sound region. Puget Sound isn't too far away and there's pipeline to move gas but Washington's refinery capacity is only about 3.4% of America's total capacity which means an outsized share of the country's finished gasoline is produced elsewhere leading to higher surpluses in other parts of the country and in turn lower prices.
- Environmental rules make West Coast gas more expensive. Oregon, Washington and California are all know for their strong environmental commitments, but those commitments do contribute to higher at the pump.
- State taxes make Oregon gas more expensive. Oregon has a tax rate of 38 cents per gallon. As well, cities can add their add additional taxes. The average gas for states is 32 cents per gallon. Supposedly every single cent of gas tax goes to road construction and repair so there is actually some return on investment that should make you feel warm and fuzzy.

As of January 2024 there are 132 operating oil refineries in the U.S.. An increase from the previous year but more closures are expected. There were 254 refineries in 1982 so there has been a significant decrease. However, total distillation capacity of all refineries has increased since 1982 with an 123% increase since per refinery since 1982.

Fuel is 60-70 cents per gallon higher in Sisters than Bend or Redmond. The supposed reason is that tankers have to make a special trip to Sisters. Funny how I see tankers driving through Sisters on their way to Bend.

In defense of the petroleum companies they probably have significant increases in drilling and/or fracking oil. Being more senior than some in the club I can remember my dad paying 15 cents per gallon for farm use. As well, in 1973 I remember telling Sande that after filling up our 1971 Corvette LT1 that I never expected ever pay 45 cents per gallon of gasoline. Little did I know.





VE Launches 2025 Yenko/SC C8 Corvette With Up To 1,250 HP

For anyone who likes the idea of a souped-up two-door <u>Chevy</u> with Yenko branding and performance, <u>SVE is offering</u> the 2025 Yenko/SC <u>C8</u> Corvette, available with up to 1,250 horsepower .At the heart of the 2025 Yenko/SC <u>Chevy Corvette</u> is the <u>6.2L V8 LT2</u> engine, which is rated at 490 horsepower in factory spec. However, in order to do the Yenko/SC name justice, SVE enhanced the LT2 with a long list of performance upgrades in addition to the turbos, including a forged steel crankshaft, forged H-beam rods, and 2618 aluminum pistons, ensuring robust performance and durability. Further upgrades include ARP high-strength head and main studs, CNC-ported high-flow cylinder heads, an upgraded valvetrain, a proprietary ground camshaft, a custom intake manifold, and integrated oil separators. The upgrade costs \$99,995.00 plus the cost of a new Corvette. OUCH!!!!!!!
