



• I created Judy's hat, being sure to meet both the requirements given by the script, what best fit the design I was given for the rest of the look, as well as the logistical restraints of the choreography that was to be performed while wearing the hat

Ensemble Work

- Pictured above is the ensemble look I created for "Cowgirl's Revenge". I created the tops and skirts for all the girls
 - 2 entire ensemble quick changes occurred, I ensured that everyone had what they needed ready & pre-set, as well as assisted in dressing and returning items to their dressing rooms.

• I created Judy's final look, using a vintage pattern. The ruffles on the hem had over 5 yards of fabric for each the nightgown and the robe.



Wash and Brush Up Sleeves

• We needed the sleeves to defy gravity while still being able to be washed. I designed a pillowcase like sleeve with foam and plastic removable inserts.

Tin Man

• I was responsible for the shading/weathering on the Tin Man's arms & legs. I also created the codpiece and the spats.

Ruby Slippers

• I create all the ruby slippers used at Land of Oz. I use sequin fabric, sequin trim, leather, glass beads, and Swarovski crystals.

I worked with mascot costumes, dance wear, historical costumes and western wear. I met many unique needs, ensuring actors were safe was my number one priority as there were many unpredictable factors such as extreme weather, live animal performances, combat and a coal powered train! I worked diligently to provide a safe experience for the actor and a family friendly experience for the guest.
