Wildwood Food Bank, After-School Snack Program

Currently the snack program serves over 425 children in need of weekend food supplementation in these Sumter County schools: Wildwood Elementary, Wildwood Intermediate, Bushnell Elementary, Webster Elementary, Panasoffkee Elementary. Accepted individually wrapped items: juice boxes, shelf-stable milk, pudding cups, oatmeal, popcorn, fruit cups/applesauce, peanut butter/cheese crackers, cookies/fruit snacks, jerky/potted meat, pretzels/chips, granola/cereal bars.

OUR PROJECTS

MOST NEEDED

- * Blankets, patriotic lap We have red, white, and blue yarn; however, we do not put it out as sometimes only the white is taken. Ask your group leader for yarn for this project.
- * Critters any character/animal up to 6" tall, lightly stuffed so they are "squishy."
- * Knitted knockers in sizes A, B, C, and D. We have specialty yarn & stuffing.
- * Plarn (plastic yarn) we have cut bags.
- * Prayer squares must be $\sim 4x5$ ", pattern on web, cardboard templates available.
- * Twiddle mats using #5 bulky yarn, placemat size, knit or crochet. Make or use items that can be firmly attached to the mats -- yarn spools, short zippers, large buttons, keys, anything with texture.

ON HOLD

- * Pillows/cardiac large pillows used to cover chest
- * Pillows/mastectomy, heart-shaped for breast cancer patients
- * Pillows/neck

NEEDED AND ONGOING

- * **Baby items** Lightweight blankets 24-26" in pastels, soft yarn. Hat/bootie sets to go with blankets. If you make a blanket, save leftover yarn for someone else to make hat/booties; helpful to include yarn label with blankets.
- * Blankets Most sizes needed: LIFE blankets, baby set blankets 24-26", size ~36" can be in baby colors or bright colors for children. Teen and adult sizes also needed. Pound of Love and one pound skeins are enough for blankets.
- * Clothing protectors
- * Eye shields for NICU babies size 2 x 9-10". Two-sided, SOFT fabrics, sewn & turned. Top stitch <u>only end</u> to close. Must be dark on one side (i.e, black flannel), pretty fabric on other side.
- * Hats/scarves/mittens for all ages
- * Hats/surgical sewn, for youth
- * Mat making from grocery bags
- * Medical dolls all parts--doll bodies, gowns, hats. Materials provided.
- * Panels 7 x 9" knitted/crocheted, any stitch pattern but not open/lacey
- * Picc line (IV) covers for all ages, baby to adult, knitted preferred
- * Pillowcases for children up to 17 years old. Cut-to-size fabric provided.
- * Pillows, port
- * Prayer pockets sewn, pattern on web

- * Scarves 4-5" wide, 36-50" long, fringe or no-fringe
- * Shawls including LIFE shawls
- * Soap sacks
- * Toiletries small travel size

NOT NEEDED

- * 14x14" baby blankets
- * Boxes
- * Grocery bags
- * Pattern books, knit needles, crochet hooks
- * Prescription bottles
- * Toddler hats (32-peg loom)

Red, white and blue yarn is still available to be used for patriotic lap blankets for veterans in hospice care. We plan on a Veteran's Day donation to VITAS Hospice in The Villages.

Baby sets are needed as an ongoing project, and include a blanket \sim 24-26", newborn hat, and booties.

Our yarn supply in storage will carry us through the rest of 2025. After the supply is depleted, we will purchase yarn from various retail stores with applied discounts.

- * Unit #6341, size 7.5x10', \$69 per month plus tax/fees, paid through the end of the year.
