From time to time, I feature an organization that receives our donations. SALT (<u>Service and Love Together</u>) has many locations including Leesburg. SALT reports that people coming to them for services has increased by 535% with over half being youth, young adults, and those over 55.

An example of how SALT helps: A mother and two daughters with no support of family or friends and no shelter were living in their car. The case management team was able to help her find a job and provide a safe living place for them while she earned income to transition off the street. In the second quarter of 2025, SALT helped 99 people find long-term housing, 40 directly through their case management and 59 through partners. So far in 2025, SALT assisted 205 people into long-term housing.

Abundance Of Love provides basic supplies like toiletries and hygiene products distributed to the homeless each week who come to the SALT mobile shower unit. It may seem like a small thing, but to them it is priceless. Thank you.

MOST NEEDED

- * Craft sale items kitchen, seasonal, gift items, greeting cards, jewelry, aprons, bowl cozies, placemats, coaster sets, etc.
- * Hats newborn (not preemie), in SOFT yarn, preferably knitted as they are generally more delicate and comfortable for babies
- * Knitted knockers Sizes B, C, and D. We provide specialty yarn & stuffing.

NOT NEEDED AT THIS TIME

- * Bags, grocery
- * Blankets, 14 x 14" baby
- * Boxes
- * Hats preemie
- * Hats toddler (32-peg loom)
- * LIFE blankets & shawls
- * Pattern books, knit needles, crochet hooks
- * Pillowcases
- * Pillows/cardiac large pillows used to cover chest

NEEDED AND ONGOING

- * **Baby items** Lightweight blankets 24-26" in pastels, soft yarn, and hat/bootie sets to go with blankets are always needed. These go to new moms as they leave the hospital.
- * Blankets All blankets, other than the baby ones noted above, should be a minimum of 36 x 36". Use pastel and bright colors for children. Please see new size chart on website. No LIFE blankets.
- * Clothing protectors
- * Critters any character/animal up to 6" tall, lightly stuffed so they are "squishy"
- * Dolls, medical we provide fabric kits to sew
- * Eye shields for NICU babies size 2 x 9-10". Two-sided, SOFT fabrics, sewn & turned. Dark on one side (i.e, black flannel), pretty fabric on other side. Top stitch only opening to close.
- * **Hats** for all ages, including preemie and newborn. No toddler size.
- * Hats/surgical for youth sewn, we have kits
- * Hearts of love we provide fabric, need set of 2
- * Mats/bag from grocery bags made on wood looms
- * Mittens for all ages
- * Panels 7 x 9" knitted/crocheted, any stitch pattern but not open/lacey
- * Picc line (IV) covers for all ages, baby to adult, knitted preferred
- * Pillowcases for children up to 17 years old. One-yard fabric pieces provided for pattern on web.
- * Pillows/child new project, contact Nancy Still
- * Pillows/heart stress small hand-size for heart patients
- * Pillows/mastectomy, heart-shaped for breast cancer patients
- * Pillows/port
- * Prayer pockets sewn, pattern on web
- * Prayer squares must be 4 x 5", pattern on web, cardboard templates available
- * Prescription bottles
- * Scarves 4-5" wide, 36-50" long. *Do NOT need scarves for children.

- * Shawls/adult Regular shawls. No LIFE shawls.
- * Soap sacks about 4 x 5", to hold regular size soap bar
- * Twiddle mats using #5 bulky yarn, placemat size, knit or crochet. Mats must be washable in hot water. Attach items carefully--strong thread, dental floss, or crochet cotton works best. NO glued-on items. Items needed to affix to mats--large buttons, thread spools, keys, small zippers, small toys, textured items, items that can be firmly attached.
