One Loom Mitten

With this pattern you don't need to worry about right and left hand. Do two the same and they can be worn either for a left or a right.

Need:

Soft #4 acrylic yarn, any color; you will use two strands together 24-peg loom, tool, and darning needle to sew thumb and finish ends.

Use two strands of yarn throughout pattern.

Choose a cuff style:

Cuff 1: Row 1. E-wrap all pegs. Flat stitch all pegs and knit off. Row 2-6. Purl first stitch, flat stitch second stitch; repeat around.

Cuff 2:

Row 1. E-wrap all pegs. E-wrap all pegs again and knit off. Row 2-6. E-wrap first stitch; purl second stitch; repeat around.

Wrist Section

Row 7. E-wrap pegs and knit off.

Row 8 –approximately 19. Repeat row 7; <u>adjusting number of rows as needed to</u> <u>cover your wrist up to the bottom of your thumb.</u> I used fewer than the pattern suggests.

Thumb Section



You will be creating a flat section to be sewn down the sides to create the thumb when the mitten is finished.

First, E-wrap pegs 1 thru 6 ONLY and knit off.

Then, repeat rows A and B below

Row A - E-wrap pegs 5 thru 1 ONLY and knit off. Row B – E-wrap peg 2 thru peg 6 ONLY and knit off

Repeat rows A and B until thumb appears big enough to fit. Original pattern suggested about 21 rows; I needed fewer.

Thumb will stick out of the side of the work.

Rest of Mitten

E-wrap all pegs and knit off until the mitten covers your hand <u>up to the top of your</u> <u>fingers.</u>

Bind off as you do with a hat.



Turn the mitten inside out and sew the sides of the thumb together. Weave in ends.
