The Western British Columbia Polytechnic College "Integrated Film Study" Diploma is specifically designed for students who are interested in film and are intended to work in film industry.

This program contains 4 courses (Acting, Directing, Film Production and Film Theory) that provide students with theoretical film and art knowledge and professional film skills. The program is completed by a film workshop practical course.

The program combines in-depth instruction with contemporary facilities and technologies. It aims to prepare creative students to master technical skills, including writing, storytelling, editing, sound, producing, and directing, to succeed in film, television, and new media industries.

### Program Objectives

- Integrated Film Study Program graduates are able to:
- Have general theoretical understandings of film arts and film production
  - Have intermediate acting/directing/producing skills with certain proficiency
  - Be familiar with film making processes and work as a fundamental/trainee-level actor/director/producer/staff on film set
  - Work for a specific position in a student film crew and finish a student film

### Methods of Evaluation

The evaluation of the students' course works is based on the course outline and assessed by instructors.

### Graduation Requirements

Students successfully complete program with at least 70% attendance and average grade of more than 50% (some courses have higher attendance requirement due to participation assessment and higher average grade too, please see individual course outlines for more detail)

Approximately 52% of Vancouver's population comprises racialized individuals, meaning they are part of visible minorities according to the Canadian Census. Moreover, 46% of the city's residents have languages other than English as their mother tongue, reflecting the linguistic diversity that further contributes to its rich cultural tapestry.
