


Let's aim for 50 backpacks! Remember this is TAX FREE WEEKEND, Fri-Sun this weekend.

Let's Build Service Projects Together




Rotary is known for *service above self*—but meaningful service doesn't happen by accident. It takes ideas, planning, and a passionate team to bring projects to life. As your new Service Projects Chair, I'm inviting you to be part of that team.

Right now, I'm in the early stages of gathering ideas for service projects that align with Rotary's areas of focus: promoting peace, fighting disease, providing clean water and sanitation, supporting mothers and children, fostering education, and growing local economies. But I don't want to do this alone—Rotary works best when we work *together*.

Would you consider joining the Service Projects Committee? Whether you love brainstorming ideas, making community connections, organizing logistics, or just want to help make a difference, your voice is needed.

One organization I've started exploring is **Tomorrow's Rainbow**, a nonprofit dedicated to nurturing emotional wellness and resilience in children and families experiencing grief or trauma. Their mission aligns with Rotary's focus on supporting children and mental health. South Carolina ranks *9th in the nation* for childhood bereavement—1 in 9 children here will lose a parent or sibling before they turn 18. That's a staggering number, and one we can help address.

I've reached out to Tomorrow's Rainbow and hope to learn soon how we might support their work—possibly through an upcoming event on **October 19**, or with a dedicated service project.



But this is just the beginning. Let's build something impactful together. If you're interested in helping shape our service efforts this year, please reach out—I'd love to have you on the committee.
