MARCH 3, 2005

## SECRETARY'S MINUTES

The minutes from the February 2005 meeting as published in the March *Wind-in-the-Willows* were unavailable, as the newsletter had not yet been delivered. They will be reviewed at the April meeting.

## TREASURER'S REPORT

Jack Baker reported a checking account balance of \$3,558.00 after payment of the costs associated with the printing of the directory totaled \$3,996.00. He reported overall ad revenue of \$4,962.00 to date, which left a profit of approximately \$966.00 with a couple of late payments still to be received.
