WRCA Meeting Minutes October 10, 2006

The meeting was called to order at 7:35 pm. In attendance were President Cam Hill, Treasurer Jack Baker, Secretary Neil Cuomo, and Board Members Ed Goetz, Pat Land, Clayton Cobb, Bill Pujolas, and Bob Foladare. Also present were Lee Baker, Tom Halter, Ron Smeller, Patrice Smeller, Joe Battaglia, John Radens, Jane Sieman, and Gary Baltz.

SECRETARY'S MINUTES

The minutes from the September meeting were reviewed. A motion was made by Clayton Cobb, seconded by Pat Land to approve the minutes, which was carried.

TREASURER'S REPORT

Jack Baker reported a checking account balance of \$8,614. He provided the Board with a breakdown of deposits and withdrawals during the prior month, and reported the budget appeared on track. Jack also reported that the WRCA liability insurance bill of \$1,287 had arrived, the same as last year. After some discussion, a motion was made by Bob Foladare, seconded by Bill Pujolas to renew the policy, which was carried. A motion was made by Neil Cuomo, seconded by Clayton Cobb to accept the Treasurer's report, which was carried. Jack also reported that after elections, minutes will need to be prepared to present to the bank to authorize change to the persons who can sign checks out of the WRCA account.

PRESIDENT'S REPORT/CORRESPONDENCE

Cam Hill reported that he received a call from Amherst Police Detective Goodwin inquiring into vandalism at the Chestnut Ridge construction site. Anyone with any information should contact the Amherst police.

Thank you letters were received from Richard Boorman and Margaret Weber, recipients of the David Lambe Memorial Scholarships. After some discussion it was determined that we would continue the scholarships and address funding of them in the 2007 budget. Bob Foladare will let the high school know, so as to allow them to better publicize the availability of the awards.



Discussion was held concerning the status of the planned construction of dormitory style apartments on Chestnut Ridge. The WRCA board had authorized a \$2,000.00 contribution to a fund created by Louise Bieron of the Chestnut Ridge Condo Association, to retain the services of an environmental attorney to seek to overturn the approval. The matter will continue to be monitored by the board. A court date was scheduled for Wednesday, October 11, 2006 in Supreme Court concerning a motion for an injunction to halt further construction until the matter is resolved.

Deborah Bucki, a town board member, appeared to answer our questions and concerns regarding this particular project, and the process involved in approval of these types of projects. Tom Halter also asked her to assist in getting some maintenance attention to the bike path behind Kaymar. She will advise the board of our concerns.

Pat Land reported on the status of the renovations and road construction surrounding the high school. He had contacted the State D.O.T. Region 5, requesting a pedestrian bridge over Sweet Home Road, which D.O.T. rejected. He also expressed concerns about the bridge over the 990 intersecting with an exit from a business park on Sweet Home. Because of the median built on Sweet Home, the cars can no longer exit directly onto Sweet Home, which necessitated the alternate exit. This will cause a dangerous situation for bikes and pedestrians coming down from the bridge.

ADJOURN

No further business being at hand, a motion was made by Bob Foladare, seconded by Pat Land to adjourn at 9:35 p.m., which was carried.
