

September 13, 2006

The meeting was called to order at 7:35 pm. In attendance were President Cam Hill, Vice President Jim Prentice, Treasurer Jack Baker, Secretary Neil Cuomo, and Board Members Ed Goetz, Pat Land, Clayton Cobb, Bill Pujolas, and Bob Foladare. Also present were Ben Procopio, Lee Baker, Kerri Jasen, Louise Bieron, Pat Wyse, Jan Stevens, Tom Brylynski, Jon Radens, and Gary Roussie.

SECRETARY'S MINUTES

There were no minutes from the informal August meeting to review.

TREASURER'S REPORT

Jack Baker reported a checking account balance of \$9,671. He provided the Board with a breakdown of deposits and withdrawals during the prior three months, and reported the budget appeared on track. A motion was made by Cam Hill, seconded by Bill Pujolas to accept the treasurer's report, which was carried.

PRESIDENT'S REPORT/CORRESPONDENCE

Cam Hill reported that a resolution sponsored by Dan Ward and passed by the town board declared, Friday, July 7, 2006 "Willow Ridge Day."

A letter was received from Patricia Bowman of the Willow Ridge Garden Club, asking the Board to consider having a budget. A town board letter was received advising of a 7-0 vote by the Board on a resolution to keep the paper street at the end of Joseph McCarthy Drive as a paper street, and further advising of the Board's opposition to the area being utilized by

ABC Rental as had been requested. A letter was received from Council Member Shelly Schratz advising of the formation of a town residents group named the "Association of Amherst Taxpayers," with the first meeting to be held on September 27, 2006 at 6:30 p.m. at town hall. She requested a representative from our group. Cam Hill will attend and is seeking interested Board members or other parties who would be willing to act as our representative.

Cam Hill also reported receiving notification of meetings of the Zoning Board of Appeals on September 19, Amherst Quality of Life Group on September 20, and the Town Planning Board on September 21. Arrangements were made for Board members to be present at theses meetings to monitor the status of the proposed construction on Chestnut Ridge.

COMMITTEE REPORTS Scholarship (Bob Foladare)

Bob requested continuation of the WRCA scholarships of \$500.00 each, which will be matched by the schools the re-





