The following is a letter written by Neil Cuomo, WRCA Secretary and an attorney with Hellerer, Cuomo, and O'Connor to Joseph Speth, Chairman with the Amherst Zoning Board of Appeals regarding 4460 Chestnut Ridge—Opposition to Variance Request

Dear Mr. Speth:

I represent the Willow Ridge Civic Association, which is comprised of over 1,300 homes in West Amherst, bounded by Niagara Falls Boulevard, South Ellicott Creek, Sweet Home, and Chestnut Ridge Roads. We are disappointed and concerned by the accelerated pace at which the proposed student housing project on Chestnut Road seems to be progressing. It abuts our development, and has our residents quite concerned. We seek the opportunity to address your Board, in order to express our concerns.

Back in 2001, MJ Peterson proposed a 440-unit series of apartments on the site in question. At that time, we expressed our concerns to the Town Board, as did representatives of the Sweet Home School District, regarding increased traffic congestion, as well as the negative ramifications of a possible "cut through" street into Willow Ridge at the end of Dalewood Drive.

Ultimately, in 2003, the Town Board approved a much smaller scale project of 136 units of the southwest portion of the property, with a condition that there be no cut-through into neighboring Willow Ridge, and that further site development would require separate approval. It appears we are now back where we started. The approved project has never been started, although MJ Peterson has obtained a number of extensions of the approval.

The current proposal is for over 200 units of "student housing," that will be located on the easterly portion of the parcel. The present proposal is **in addition to** the 136 units already approved, and seeks a Variance, due to the planned third floor of housing. This proposal is far different than the initial proposal made in 2001.

The very character of the proposed housing does not appear to fit the MFR5 zoning designation of the land. Furthermore, there has been no compliance with the SEQR mandates, as an Environmental Impact Study (EIS) has not been done, nor has the Army Corps of Engineers provided any input on this proposed project cannot rely on the EIS from an entirely different proposal, submitted almost 6 years ago.

Every precaution should be taken in evaluation proposals and granting variances, considering the poor drainage, rodent proliferation, and sinking foundation issues plaguing parts of our town. Consideration must also be given to the substantial new construction which has already taken place in our area, since the first MJ Peterson proposal. It would be irresponsible to allow this project to be approved and a Variance granted, without further study.

It cannot be understated that to date, there has been **no approval of this proposed project.** The approval of the MJ Peterson units referenced above, while on the same parcel, specifically required new studies as a predicate to any subsequent approval for site development, including this separate and distinct project.

Since the construction of similar student housing on Chestnut Ridge near Sweet Home, and on Sweet Home across from the high school, police calls have increased ten fold in the area. A project of this magnitude will surely result in a substantial increase in traffic on Chestnut Ridge and the surrounding roads.

The cut-through to Dalewood Drive remains of great concern to our residents. It would in effect create a thoroughfare running directly through the middle of a residential neighborhood, disrupting the quiet nature of the area.

Many of the homes in our neighborhood back up to this parcel on Chestnut Ridge, and allowing a taller structure than properly zoned, literally in their backyards, seems unreasonable. Here should be discussion and consideration to the use of berms or other buffers, or other alternatives, in order to lessen the impact on neighboring housing units and communities, before this proposal is allowed to proceed in any form.

Our Association was never notified about this proposal, and would not have learned about it but for being contacted by concerned residents in the affected area. I understand that your Board is meeting on July 18, 2006 at 7:00 p.m. Although this proposal has been tabled and is slated to only be discussed in Executive Session, we would like the opportunity to express our concerns at your regular meeting. We appreciate your consideration in this matter, and look forward to your anticipated cooperation.


