The board also approved distributions to Latko Printing of \$3,208.13 for publication of the directories, and to Dollars for Scholars for \$1,000.00 to fund our two newly formed \$500.00 scholarships.

A special thank you was extended to Barry Moir for his assistance in collecting of checks for directory ads and dues while Jack was away.

PRESIDENT'S REPORT

Cam Hill advised that he had contacted Willow Ridge Elementary School to inquire as to whether they would be interested in having an art contest for design of a new directory cover.
