Cinnamon Apple Popcorn

- 2 cups chopped dried apples
- 10 cups popped popcorn
- 2 cups pecan halves
- 4 tablespoons butter, melted
- 1 teaspoon cinnamon
- 1/4 teaspoon nutmeg
- 2 tablespoons brown sugar
- 1/4 teaspoon vanilla extract

Directions:

- 1. Preheat oven to 250 degrees F.
- 2. Place apples in a large shalow baking pan. Bake 20 minutes.
- 3. Remove pan from oven and stir in popcorn and nuts.
- 4. In a small bowl combine reaining ingredients.
- 5. Drizzle butter mixture over popcorn mixture, stirring well.

6. Bake for 30 minutes, stirring every 10 minutes.
7. Pour onto wax




Management and a minor in Exercise Sport Science. She is resently the assistant/pitching coach for Medaille College.





Amherst Fun Facts

In July 2010, CNNMoney ranked Amherst 42nd in a list of the Top 100 Best Places to Live in America. In 2012, CNNMoney.com ranked Amherst 50th. In 2011 and 2012, Amherst was selected as one of America's 100 Best Communities for Young People by America's Promise Alliance. Most recently in 2014, Amherst was ranked the #1 Safest City in America with a population between 100,000 and 500,000. There are five separate higher educational institutions with campuses in the town.

University at Buffalo (oldest college in WNY), Daemen College, Erie Community College, Bryant &

Stratton College (second oldest college in WNY) and a satellite campus of Canisius College.



The town of Amherst was created by the State of New York on April 10, 1818

Named after Lord Jeffrey Amherst. Amherst was formed from part of the town of Buffalo. Timothy S. Hopkins was elected the first supervisor of the town of Amherst in 1819. Part of Amherst was later used to form the town of Cheektowaga in 1839.

Archives Center is
housed in the Former
Reformed Mennonite
Church. The building was
listed on the National
Register of Historic
Places in 2003.



History The Ellicott Creek Volunteer Fire Co. had its beginnings in the latter part of 1943 and early 1944, when members of the community decided there was a need for a fire department to provide service for the northwest portion of the Town of Amherst.

The initial organizational meeting was held on October 16th, 1944 at District 16, located on North Ellicott Creek Road. The first order of business was the selection of the name for the organization. The name Ellicott Creek Auxiliary Fire Company Branch 1 was chosen.

On February 16th, 1986 the new firehall was completed and we moved across the street. In 2016, another station was added on Sweet Home Road to meet our increasing demands.
