# WRCA Minutes

## WRCA Minutes May 9th, 2017

The May WRCA meeting was called to order at 7:35 pm by President Erich Krueger.

In attendance were President Erich Krueger, Board Members Andy Annesi, John Radens, Cassie Schwab and Marijean Nichols.

**Secretary's Report:** A motion was made and seconded to approve the April minutes as submitted by Secretary Jane Sieman. Jane was excused from tonight's meeting and had submitted the minutes beforehand to the President for distribution. Marijean Nichols agreed to take the minutes for the May meeting.

**Treasurer's Report:** The Treasurer's Report for this month will be e-mailed to be considered at the June meeting.

**Cell Tower Update:** The Amherst Town Board has approved a 140 day moratorium on new cell towers. The will hire a consultant to study the need for more bandwidth in the town. There is a fee per application for the town to hire the consultant. An advisory committee will be set up to review the cell tower issue and we will try to have a Willow Ridge member on this committee to represent our neighborhood concerns.

## Discussion (Old and New Business):

WRCA has a window to appeal and re-apply with a description in order to get our 501c4 tax status back. We have the necessary paperwork done and have two months to submit. There is an application fee so we need to determine the value in keeping the tax status.

Tom Amodeo is looking at new options to modify the website to have an up-to-date social media presence on Facebook and Twitter. Tom would like to step down as Vice President but has offered to continue as webmaster/email person. Andy Annesi was nominated to the Vice President position. Cassie Schwab was nominated to take Andy's position as board member.

Two Willow Ridge high school seniors will be awarded the WRCA scholarships this year. Erich will present the winners with their scholarships on June 19th.

The annual neighborhood garage sale will be held on the week-end of June 9th-11th. Joe Battaglia will take care of the advertising and signs for this event.

We will firm up the plans for National Night Out and our neighborhood movie night to be held at the beginning of August at the June meeting. Erich will check with John Miller on the activities planned for

National Night Out and both events will be advertised in the WITW. A suggestion was made about holding a neighborhood block party in conjunction with the annual movie night as a possible addition to our annual summer events in the future.

The possibility of new events such as a Willow Ridge date for families at Rollie Pollie has received positive feedback from the neighborhood. The enjoyment of our children in the bounce house at the Easter in April leads us to plan for other opportunities for family fun. A thank you to Amherst Community Church for providing all the activities and also to our wonderful Willow Ridge baker, Alissa Shields and her students for providing the delicious treats. Also, a special thank you to the Easter Bunny for stopping in to take pictures with the children.

Our new artistic editor of WITW is doing a good job in publishing newsletter. The Greeks were the first to use solar architecture, over 2,000 years ago. They learned to build their houses to take maximum advantage of the solar energy. The sun's rays entered their homes during the winter, but weren't able to enter during the summer.

No new cell towers or other wireless telecommunication facilities will be installed in Amherst for at least the next 140 days.

The Town Board on Monday night approved the temporary moratorium as town officials there grapple with how to regulate the rapidly changing wireless industry.

A newly formed committee composed of various stakeholders has been tasked with studying appropriate standards and restrictions for placement of cell towers in the public right-of-way. The committee will report its findings and recommendations to the Town Board.

The moratorium halts all pending applications, including eight by Mobilitie and Sprint and a dozen by Verizon Wireless in the Willow Ridge neighborhood.

The last week of school is an exciting time for children and they may become preoccupied and forget the rules of the road. Use extra caution when driving through school zones.

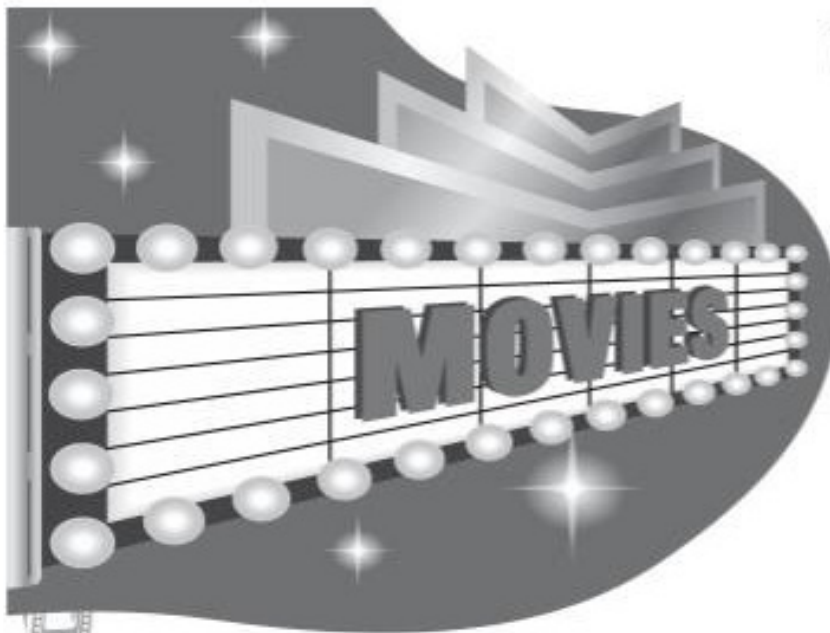

# Peppertree Drive Neighbor Helping Children Overseas

Thousands of miles away from the comforts of home, Peppertree Drive resident Janice Pichette, RN, is making a difference in the lives of children with spinal deformities.

As president and founder of the non-profit organization World Spine Outreach, she assembles a team of medical professionals each year to provide advanced orthopedic spinal and neurological medicine to underserved areas around the globe.

In February, she traveled to Santo Domingo in the Dominican Republic on a medical mission trip. In collaboration with the Butterfly Foundation, they performed spinal corrective procedures on 22 individuals, changing their lives forever.



***"This is how I leave my stamp on the world,"*** said Janice, who works full-time as a clinical nurse in Kenmore Mercy Hospital's Operating Room. ***"I am helping children who would dies otherwise."***

The goal of World Spine Outreach is to provide care to individuals in disadvantaged communities who have little or no access to this level of technology or trained medical personnel. Correction of spinal deformity provides improved quality of life, increased productivity and possibly social acceptability. 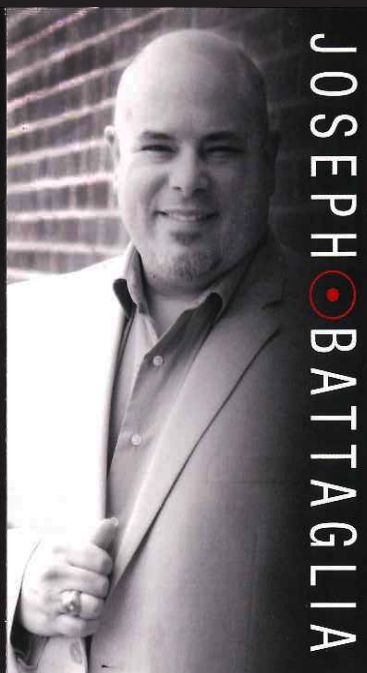
