

#### **WRCA Board Meeting**

April 12, 2016

There has been some confusion concerning the Holiday Lighting Contest as reported in the minutes from the March 2016 meeting. The following explanation should clear up any misunderstanding.

The Willow Ridge Civic Association sponsors the Annual Holiday Lighting Contest each December. Acknowledgement and small prizes are awarded to the winning members of this contest each year. The contest is open to any residence that is a member of the Willow Ridge Civic Association. The judges of the 2015 Holiday Lighting Contest selected the top ten decorated homes in the community. Each of the ten winners was to be awarded a \$10.00 Valu Home Centers gift certificate, donated to the Willow Ridge Civic Association by Valu for this purpose. The decorated homes are judged independently, based on the merit of their decoration. After touring the neighborhood, twenty homes were considered and the top ten homes were voted as winners. Once selected, the judges then go to the membership roster so the winners can be acknowledged appropriately. Of the top ten winning



homes, only five of the winning residences were qualified as members of the Willow Ridge Civic Association. After five of the top ten winning homes did not meet the necessary membership requirement, the judges reconsidered the remaining ten homes and the qualified winners were then chosen for award.

Hopefully, this clears up any misunderstanding. The WRCA works for the benefit of our membership. That work benefits the entire community, regardless of membership. However, it is our membership dues which allow the WRCA to function. While officers and board members do not receive any compensation, the events we sponsor for the community do need funds to provide the quality of life we enjoy in Willow Ridge.

The April meeting of the WRCA was called to order at 7:30pm by President Jim Cwierley. In attendance were Treasurer Donna Mosteller, Secretary Marijean Nichols and Board Members Tom Amodeo, Andy Annesi, John Radens and Connie Holovics. A motion was made and approved to accept the minutes from the March meeting.

Treasurer's Report: Income for the month of March was \$85. Expenses for the month were \$1,255. The balance for the month of March was \$1,424. A motion was made and approved to accept the March report.

At this time, Treasurer Donna Mosteller updated the Board on new workflows as she fully takes over the Treasurer's position. Expenses will now be recorded at the time they are accrued instead of when checks are cashed. All monies collected for events and payment to vendors will be processed through the treasurer. Invoices from vendors need to be received in order for payment to be made. Any volunteer or member who incurs expenses in the course of providing services for the WRCA will now need to turn in detailed receipts for and explanation of the expense before payment is reimbursed. Donna needs to meet with the new

Dear Willow Ridge Neighbors,

My heart pulled as I watched the yellow school bus swallow up my youngest daughter, the door collapsing behind her with a soft *whump*. She was dressed in her brand new "first day of school" clothes with her name safety-pinned in pink securely to her dress. My youngest daughter was stepping into the roller coaster world of academia with her two older sisters by her side.

Blinking my eyes clear I began working on the *Wind-in-the-Willows*, my newest project. I was a newbie of sort in Willow Ridge. We had moved in only five years earlier, when that same little girl, who had just been swept up and away to kindergarten, was born. WRCA President Ed Cavan had asked me if I could serve as the editor of the neighborhood newsletter. If you sit in the silence and pay attention, Life, or maybe it is Instinct, tells you it is time to move on. Kelly was now also in school, and there was a spot to fill in my life. So, I said "yes" to Ed, thrilled at the concept of assembling the newsletter for the WRCA.

I gazed at the heap of paper from neighbors in front of me - all manner of colors, sizes, and shapes, many of which were handwritten. Time had to be spent deciphering the cursive styles. In these early days, there was no email, or any electronic transfer of information. Once the sorting was done, the keyboarding began, using the latest and greatest software, Word Perfect. All aspects of this task appealed to me; the sorting, diligence and art of creating the newsletter which was previously accomplished by three volunteers.

Once entered into the computer (yes, we had computers), it was printed out on the dot-matrix and checked for errors, re-edited and reprinted. Now it was time to add the clip art, painstakingly cut and pasted to the copy using scissors and rubber cement. Product complete, I now had to drive to the printer on Union in Cheektoaga. Obviously, all this did not happen in one or two sittings, it occurred in between the chaos of family life for two weeks every month.

I'm smiling as I think back at the time-saving strides technology has provided in thirty years. These days the only pasting that is done is electronic. I've grown older in that span of time. Nine years in from the day I started as editor, my husband acquired an illness that left him paralyzed for a month. Ten years in, we added a son to our three girls. Twenty-four years in, I began working again outside the home. Fast forward to the present; my girls are married and my son has grown up and out of the house. In the thirty years I have been the *Wind-in-the-Willows* editor, I have gone from being a *young* mother to (allow me to go out on a limb here) a *young* grandmother of *seven* grandchildren! My parents, incredibly and thankfully are still with us and surprisingly healthy. My life is wonderfully – well, ALIVE! In that time I have not only lived a span of years, I have been recording the life and breath of the WRCA and the experiences of many neighbors who make up our family of Willow Ridge. I have met so many of you in person, and many more of you I know by voice on the phone or by email. What an honor I have been afforded! The WRCA and this neighborhood are combined to make a very special entity, and for me to have served in this capacity for so many years, well, if I may steal a line from a song Julie Andrews rendered in the *Sound Of Music*, "I must have done something good."

Dear neighbors, I have been sitting in silence and listening once again. Life, or yes, maybe Instinct, is telling me that it is time to move on. I am happy to say that through thick and thin, ups and downs, I have never missed producing an issue of the *Wind-in-the-Willows*. I have worked with countless board members, presidents, block reps, and neighbors and have met so many wonderful people who have contributed their essence to whom I strive to be. I wish I could name all of you, but there are simply too many. As I retire, my heart pulls yet again as I thank you, the heart of Willow Ridge, for filling that "spot" in my life with something permanent and special.
