WRCA to vote on board size reduction

There may soon be one less seat at the table for the Willow Ridge Civic Association.

By unanimous vote, the WRCA decided to reduce the number of board seats from 10 to 9. This eliminates a seat that was vacated when Donna Mosteller became treasurer in January. In accordance with WRCA by-laws, this motion was tabled until the February meeting to allow for public comment.

After that comment period, the board will vote on the motion again at that meeting. If the motion carries a second time, the WRCA by-laws will be amended to reduce the board members to 9. The next board meeting will be held at 7 p.m. at the Ellicott Creek Fire Hall, 45 S. Ellicott Creek Road.

'The move allows the WRCA to function more smoothly, while still providing great service and representation to the neighborhood,' said Jim Cwierley, WRCA president.

The board reduction is a procedural rule that increases board functionality. By WRCA rules, a 2/3 majority of board members must be present for a board meeting to be legal. With 10 members on the board, 6 needed to be there to hold a valid meeting.

By reducing the number to 9, only 5 need to be there for the meeting to 'count'. This had been an issue in the past, when there wasn't a quorum of board members there. Eliminating the seat does not mean there will be a loss in representation for the neighborhood. With just more than 400 member families, there still will be one board member for every 44 members.

If any WRCA members want to comment on the proposal, please come to the meeting on February 10.

WRCA Minutes; January 12, 2016

The meeting was opened by President Jim Cwierley at 7:30 pm. Also in attendance were Vice President Mark Hammer, Treasurer Donna Mosteller and Secretary Marijean Nichols and Board Members John Radens, Andy Annesi, Connie Holovics, Errich Krueger and Tom Amodeo. Jane Sieman also attended. There was one member from the community who attended. The minutes from the December meeting were approved.

Treasurer's Report: Income for the month of December was \$1,394. Expenditures for the month were \$1,727. The balance for December 2015 was \$3,455. The report for December was approved.

Membership Report: To date, we have 401 paid memberships for 2016. See President's Report for update on new membership and directory volunteer.

President's Report: Volunteers are needed for the Annual Wine Tasting Event (to be held on 1/30/16 at Classics at 7:00 p,) to take tickets, help with raffles, etc. Tickets are still available to attend this event. Lynn Getzin no longer wishes to be involved with the membership and directory. Jane Sieman has once again stepped forward to work on the 2016 membership directory. Jane will work with Connie on finally updating the membership list to give to the block reps so they can get involved again.

As we transition to a new Treasurer, Donna will take a look at the books so she can forecast where we are financially for the new year. Jim asked the Board to make a constitutional change to reduce the WRCA Board from 10 members to 9 by eliminating one Board Member position (currently vacant). A motion to do this was made and seconded. According to the Constitution, this change must now be published in the *WITW* for membership input before it can be voted on. After much discussion by the board, both pro and con, this motion was tabled and is now being published for membership input. A vote on the motion will then be taken at the next meeting. Jim also raised the issue of reducing the number of meetings we hold each year. There was much discussion on this suggestion, but no changes are being made at this time.

New Business: Derrick Ong, former Board Member, had set up applications to be used with our website and new app. Tom Amodeo is working with the former webmaster on this new architecture to get the website and app working to full capacity.

In the past, WRCA has had a volunteer who filed taxes for the organization each year. As a not-for-profit group, we do not have to file a tax return, however, we are in need of a new volunteer.

There have been some issues in the neighborhood with items being delivered by UPS, etc., being stolen when left at a residence's door. There will be an increased police presence in the neighborhood. A new task force has been set up to address the increasing problem of foreclosed/abandoned houses in Amherst.

The Easter event for the Willow Ridge children is scheduled for 3/19/16. Plans are being firmed.

Old Business: The winners of the holiday lighting party will be awarded their prizes shortly. Each winner will receive a \$10 Valu Home Center gift card, donated by Valu Home Centers, a locally owned business. Anthony Day, Superintendent of Sweet Home Schools, will be the guest speaker at the WRCA February meeting. All members interested in our schools are encouraged to attend (note the change of meeting day and time for this event).

The meeting was adjourned at 9:00 pm. The next meeting of the WRCA will be held on Wednesday, February 10th, 2016 at the Ellicott Creek Fire Hall starting at 7:00 pm.
