

Sweet Home School Superintendent Anthony Day Presents At The WRCA February Board Meeting's Distinguished Speakers Series



Enrollment at Willow Ridge Elementary includes 321 students for the 2015/16 school year. The average class size in our elementary school is 16.9 pupils per classroom. The middle school's enrollment is 739 students with an average class size of 21.7 pupils per classroom. The high school's enrollment is 1037 students with an average class size of 21.6 pupils per classroom. Total enrollment for the Sweet Home District, grades K-12, is 3171 students.

The district is working on increasing Elementary and Middle Proficiency rates by 5% per year in each building. While the graduation rate for the high school is currently 93.9%, the District is working on improving advanced designation graduation rates. The Sweet Home Schools are working to improve the quality and effectiveness of core instruction by identifying and responding to student learning while in process. Instructional coaching will be a critical component to build greater student engagement and foster classroom communities.

The District is also working to establish Career Pathways at the High School level and elementary enrichment via Library/Science and Math enrichment through Math Specialists.

The work on upgrading the sports facilities at the high school has been completed; Willow Ridge Elementary School has undergone improvements to increase the safety of students with an enhanced school entry system and by the work done to the parking lot, making safer entry and exit areas for cars picking up students while the school buses are doing the same.

The estimated percentage increase for the 2016-17 tax levy is 2.49%. Under this proposed budget draft, all current programming and school configurations will remain the same. This tax levy meets the local tax cap figure.

The Sweet Home School District was the first to provide I-pads to all students for instructional use at grade level. Mr. Day answered questions about using calculators in the solving of math problems, when children are taught basic cursive writing and regarding busing. The Superintendent finished his presentation around 8 pm.

While no official business was conducted, the Board discussed several issues after Mr. Day left. This short discussion about upcoming community events is reported on page 3.
