## **WRCA Board Meeting Minutes**

## November 8, 2016

The November meeting of the WRCA was called to order at 7:30 pm by President Jim Cwierley.

In attendance were Vice President Erich Krueger, Treasurer Donna Mosteller and Secretary Marijean Nichols. Also in attendance were board members Tom Amodeo, John Radens and Andy Annesi and membership chair Jane Sieman. Brian and Dawson Rieman also attended.

**Secretary's Report:** The Secretary Report was deferred due to the Secretary's absence at the October meeting.

**Treasurer's Report:** Income for the month of September was \$536. Expenditures for the month were \$1,385. The balance for September was \$309. Income for the month of October was \$0. Expenditures for the month were \$43. The balance for October was \$266. A motion was made and approved to accept the Treasurer's Report for September and October.

President's Report: The membership drive for 2017 is underway. Members who might request a hard copy of the all-digital WITW can call Jane to receive a copy. The Holiday Tree Lighting will be on Saturday, December 3 at 5 p.m. Jim will check on the public lighting around that corner A date for annual Wine Tasting Event will be set after confirmation of venue. the cost will remain at \$25/ person. WRCA will update their banking as soon as the previous president responds to set up a time to meet the current Treasurer at the bank to sign off. The advertising mock-ups are updated making it much easier to place ads in WRCA publications. With input from WRCA, Imagine Amherst has developed the prototype for future retail and provided drawings. The Amherst Highway Supervisor has asked to appear at our next monthly meeting to discuss any community issues.

**Old Business:** The annual Halloween party was a success and we thank Amherst Baptist Church for all the help they provided. Thank you also to WGRZ News for their coverage of Willow Ridge's scary decorated homes. Suggestions were discussed regarding making the Willow Ridge/ Niagara Falls Boulevard traffic corridor safer. The

insurance for WRCA has been paid. Bringing back some of the previous WRCA holiday traditions was discussed. For our next Wine Tasting Event we would like to add more basket raffle type fundraising as proceeds from this event help to fund our annual scholarships. Jane has been updating the membership list and actively signing up neighbors, working on new members even before the membership's official drive in October.

New Business: The annual Snowflake Dinner Dance will be held on Saturday, March 4, 2017 at Classics. The cost this year including dinner, open bar and music/dancing will be \$80/couple. All money and checks for this event are to be given to the treasurer before the event so that she can write checks for all expenses incurred for this event after receiving proper receipts for each expense. Judging for the annual holiday lighting contest will be done on the weekend of December 16-18 this year and winning homes will be in the January WITW.

**Elections** were held for the upcoming terms of office which start January 1, . Current President Jim Cwierley's term is up and he is not eligible to run for another term as WRCA's by-laws have term limits. ## **Lead Testing Mandated at Schools**

In October, parents of current Willow Ridge students were notified of the results of New York State mandated lead testing of all cold water outlets in elementary schools.

Fifteen outlets exceeded the NYS threshold of fifteen parts per billion. The water supply to these outlets has been shut off until remediation and retesting meets the threshold. Testing in middle and high schools must be completed by October 31, 2016.

Willow Ridge Elementary opened in 1966. Building materials used before 1986 may contain significant amounts of lead. Schools have intermittent water use patterns. This usage is more likely to cause elevated levels of lead due to prolonged contact with plumbing materials. Lead is a natural occurring element with many industrial uses. While exposure to high levels of lead have adverse health effects on everyone, children are at higher risk.

Growing bodies absorb lead more easily than adults, their brain and nervous system are more sensitive to the damaging effects of lead. Parents concerned about a child's exposure to lead should contact their health care provider. A simple blood test can check your child for lead exposure.

Everyone can lower their exposure to lead at home. Use only cold water to prepare food and drinks, keep the home clean and dust-free, maintain painted surfaces to prevent deterioration and teach children to wash their hands after playing outdoors. Make sure your family eats well-balanced meals, children with healthy diets absorb less lead.
