# **WRCA Recharges Block Rep Program**



Sometimes, the old ways are best.

The Willow Ridge Civic Association hopes that holds true, as we look to revamp and energize the block rep program. The organization hopes the block reps will help improve a sagging membership, which is down 100 members from the previous year.

Connie Holovics, a WRCA board member and block rep, hosted a breakfast at her Denrose Drive home on January 17, distributing new neighbor welcome kits and explaining strategies for encouraging people to renew their memberships. Fifteen block reps came to learn about the new plans.

"We're getting back in the flow," she said. "Everyone who was here was really gung-ho and cares about the neighborhood. We need to find out what's happening with neighbors, and we need to welcome new residents so they know about all the services and events we provide."

The block reps had long been key to boosting membership drives, welcoming new residents to the neighborhood, and passing along news of interest to WRCA members. Volunteers on each street would collect membership dues, and familiarize new neighbors with what our community is all about.

In the mid-2000s, the board started relying less on block reps to carry out membership drives, instead using postcards and notes in the *Wind-in-the-Willows*. As a result, the block reps slowly became less active in the WRCA. Connie Holovics aims to change all that.

Block reps will again be going door-to-door, visiting with both new neighbors, and talking with members who did not renew from the previous year.

"I think people just forgot," she said. "With the block reps going door-to-door, it reminded them to renew. And it's really hard to say 'no' when a neighbor comes knocking."

Marge LaHood, a block rep on Parkhaven Drive for 40 years, said the program is more important than ever to build neighborhoods. She thinks changes in technology has caused a lack of communication amongst neighbors. "Email and everything is great, but it really stifles sociability; people don't talk. You've got to talk to your neighbors."

The WRCA is still looking for block reps who want to help out in this very important effort. If you would like to volunteer just a few minutes of your time each month, all while meeting your neighbors, contact Connie Holovics at 691-9569.



# WRCA MINUTES January 14th, 2015

The meeting was opened at 7 p.m. by President Jim Cwierley. In attendance were Vice President Mark Hammer, Treasurer Tom Amodeo and (shortly thereafter) Secretary Marijean Nichols. Board of Directors Members Andy Annesi, John Ball, Connie Holovics, Erich Krueger, Derrick Ong and Rick VonLangen also attended. Membership/Circulation Chairperson Lynn Getzin attended. Community attendees were Roseanne & Art Grasha, John Radens and Dave DeMeester.

Secretary Minutes: A motion was made and seconded to approve the minutes from the December 2014 meeting. Motion approved.

Treasurer's Report: Income for the month of December 2014 was \$1,162 from the yearly membership sign-up and dues that were received during the month. The expenses totaled \$816 for this month. The balance was \$5,448. A motion was made and seconded to approve the Treasurer's Report. Motion approved.

Membership Report: Lynn Getzin reported there are approximately 481 memberships paid to date. This number is down from last year at this time. Everyone should be using the same form when signing up and paying their dues for this year. Connie Holovics has put together a new package to handout at the event she is hosting for the block representatives in January. The block reps are key to making families aware of the many amenities provided by the WRCA. The membership drive will again be promoted in the February *WITW*. The membership information needs to be ready by 2/15/15. Once again, we will highlight the many community events sponsored by the association in the next newsletter.

Old Business: We were updated on the new Willow Ridge website. Rick VonLangen is talking to businesses about advertising in the directory for 2015. The business agenda was completed at 7:30 pm followed by a short break before the evening's Public Speaker.

Sweet Home School Superintendent Anthony Day opened the presentation at 7:40 pm by introducing the new principal at Willow Ridge and the School Safety Officer. Mr. Day then updated us on the upcoming capital projects that will be done this year including a new track and tennis courts and an artificial turf for the stadium. Also, the parking lots at the high school will be redone and new air-conditioning will be put in the district offices.

Willow Ridge Elementary School needs a new roof. The parking lot there will also be redesigned with concrete extending to the bike racks. Even tougher security standards will be implemented throughout the district and will be in place by next year.

Common Core was also discussed. The district is providing coaching for teachers in implementing this program. Registration is down in the district, Willow Ridge enrolled far fewer new students in Kindergarten this year. The district is seeking volunteers from the community to be involved with many issues including the advisability of having student uniforms. After answering questions, the guests were thanked for addressing our concerns.

The meeting was adjourned at 8:45 pm.

The next meeting of the WRCA will be held on Tuesday, February 10<sup>th</sup>, 2015 at 7:30 pm at the Fire Hall.


