WRCA MINUTES April 14, 2015

The meeting was opened at 7:35 p.m. by President Jim Cwierley. In attendance were Vice President Mark Hammer, Secretary Marijean Nichols, Treasurer Tom Amodeo and Board Members Andy Annesi, Erich Krueger, Derrick Ong, Rick VonLangen and John Radens. Debby VonLangen, editor of the *Wind-in-the-Willows*, also attended. The minutes from the March meeting, as published in this month's *WITW*, were approved.

Treasurer's Report: Income for the month of March was \$2160. The expenses for the month totaled \$798. The balance was \$6556. The report was approved.

President's Report: Membership has exceeded 500 families this year. The updated directory is at the printer and should be out by the end of the month. We will review the annual budget at the next meeting. We would like to have a speaker series of interest to Willow Ridge residents starting in the fall. The Octoberfest/Race night annual event, an enjoyable fund-raiser for the association, may return with a new format and was tabled until the next meeting. There was a

discussion about updating the *Wind-in-the-Willows*. Jim would like us to update the front page with a new logo and a (much shorter) Secretary's minutes. Neighbor news is most important and there are other features we could add such as news from the town supervisor's office, the police blotter, constructive comments from our Facebook page and more articles that would give the newsletter more structure. The editor was very helpful in explaining that we need more articles contributed every month and the difficulty of putting together the newsletter each month when there few submissions. After this lengthy dialogue, it was decided that we will try a new format starting with the June newsletter.

Old Business: 48 families enjoyed this year's Easter party. Thank you to those who volunteered to help with this event. The Willow Ridge app is ready. Derrick Ong and the interns who worked on the development of the app gave a presentation to those in attendance (see below).

New Business: The application procedure for eligible Sweet Home High School seniors to be considered for a WRCA scholarship is under review at this time. Also, we received a suggestion to initiate a WRCA neighbor of the month program to thank those unsung heroes who are always helping out without expecting recognition.

The union representing those workers who run the summer movie will be generously funding the event this year. The meeting was adjourned at 9:30 p.m.


