From Snow to

Allergy Cemperatures are weather this wi

emperatures are finally on the rise in Buffalo, which is quite different from the frigid weather this winter. The fluctuating mercury combined with piles of snow storm debris are making it hard to breathe for allergy sufferers.

In fact, Buffalo was recently ranked #26 on the 2014 Spring Allergy Capitals list from the Asthma and Allergy Foundation of America. This is based to higher than average pollen counts, high use of allergy medications by local patients and too few allergy specialists in the metro area.

The location, climate, different types of trees, and industrial pollution alone make Buffalo a target for allergy victims, but the variety of weather and now debris on the ground is making it even worse.

The record setting snow fall on the east could also mean a late flowering season for trees. That means that once the temperatures do warm up, pollinating trees will be busy catching up, spewing higher than average amounts of sneezing and sniffles, inducing allergens into the spring air.

If you are not sure of what you are dealing with, it's probably a good idea to visit a doctor or pharmacist, who may go over your medical history.


