WRCA Minutes

October 8, 2013

President Rick VonLangen called the meeting to order at 7:32 p.m. Also present were Vice President James Cwierley, Treasurer Ed Goetz, and Secretary Dawn Cwierley. Board members present were Mark Hammer, Connie Holovics, Thomas Amodeo, and Carol Zaffrom. Community attendees included Lynn Getzin, John Radens, Lisa Kistner (from Supervisor Weinstein's office), Dave De-Meester, and Ben Procopio.

Secretary Minutes: A motion was made by Jim Cwierley to approve the secretary minutes from the September meeting. Carol Zaffram seconded and board approval followed.

Treasurer Report: Ed Goetz, Treasurer, reported that the August account balance was \$7,366 and the September account balance was \$5,903. Connie Holovics made a motion to approve, seconded by Thomas Amodeo and board approval was granted.

Membership Report: Lynn Getzin and Ed Goetz reported that we had received \$57 in membership so far. Campaign started on October 1. It was noted that the mail house inadvertently did not include the pre-addressed enveloped. The mail house will cover the cost for a new mailing that will come out next month.

President's Report: Rick VonLangen discussed neighbor concern about parties in the neighborhood. Neighbors are advised to contact the police should they have concerns about sound ordinance or rowdy behavior.

Old Business: Ed Goetz reported that the electronic recycling event is planned for October 19 at the firehouse. The board discussed plans for a speaker series next year. Potential speakers are Sweet Home Superintendent Tony Day, the Amherst Town Supervisor, and the Chief of Police. Dawn Cwierley discussed the upcoming Children's Halloween Party set for October 26. Needed are 8 – 10 volunteers to help with set up, assist children with crafts and games, and distribute snacks.

New Business:

Ben Procopio discussed plan for the 50th Anniversary of WRCA. Carol Zaffram will work closely with Ben and his committee on incorporating anniversary into the dinner dance which potentially will take place the second Saturday in March. Lisa Kistner from the Town offered to check with the town historian any photos or special activities that are on record for the neighborhood.

The Board reviewed the status of current directors and noted that we are still in need of a new board member and a treasurer for 2014.

Adjournment: With no further items on the agenda, a motion was made by Dawn Cwierley and seconded Jim Cwierley to adjourn at 8:50 p.m. The next meeting is Tuesday, November 12, at the Ellicott Creek Fire Hall at 7:30 p.m. All Willow Ridge residents are welcome. TIPS TO PREVENT KITCHEN FIRES

- 1) STOVE TOP COOKING. Don't leave the kitchen while cooking on a stove top. Most kitchen fires start when people leave food cooking unattended.
- 2) BROILERS. Also stay in the kitchen when you are broiling food in the oven.
- 3) TIMERS. Use a timer to remind you when food is done cooking. It's easy to get distracted.
- 4) POTS AND PANS. Turn the handles of pots and pans on the stove inward to avoid accidents.
- 5) COOKING OIL. Don't allow cooking oil to overheat. Cooking oil that is smoking is about to start on fire.
- 6) COMBUSTIBLES. Keep dish towels, grocery shopping lists, plastic bags and appliance cords away from burners. Move anything that can catch fire away from the stove.
- 7) CLOTHING. Long sleeves, ties, scarves, large fitting shirts, bathrobes, and aprons can catch fire from hot burners.
- 8) KIDS AND PETS. Designate a kid-free zone of at least 3 feet around the stove. Keep pets off cooking surfaces.

Keep Your Home, Your Haven

As the weather starts to get cooler, we will start to see evidence of wildlife coming closer to our homes in search of food. If unwanted critters find your property tasty, chances are good that they will start visiting more often. Your first step should be to eliminate what is tempting them.

- · Be sure your trash is always covered.
- · Never leave unprotected animal food outside at night.
- Remove any fruits, nuts, or berries that have fallen to the ground. While the above food sources are the most common culprits that attract animals, there are more. If any of these exist on your property, do your best to minimize or eliminate them.
- · Compost heaps containing bones, fruit rinds and egg shells.
- Large numbers of ground dwelling insects under dead leaves and foliage.
- · Easily accessible water sources.
- · Bird feeder spills.

Always be cautious when around wildlife they could have rabies. If you see an animal acting strangely, disoriented, foaming at the mouth or overly aggressive - get away from it and call animal control.


Willow Ridge Garden Club
