WRCA Minutes May 9, 2013

President Rick VonLangen called the meeting to order at 7:31 p.m. Also present were Vice President James Cwierley, Treasurer Ed Goetz, and Secretary Dawn Cwierley. Board members present were Tom Amodeo, Mark Hammer, Connie Holovics, and Bill VanSplunder. Community attendees included Debby VonLangen, *Wind-in-the-Willows* editor; Ben Procopio, Joe Battaglia, Thomas Gugliuzza, Lynn Mancuso, Sandy Radens, John Radens, Barb Nuchereno (Amherst Town Board), and Thomas Johnston (Roswell).

Secretary Minutes: A motion was made by Jim Cwierley to approve the secretary minutes from the April meeting. Ed Goetz seconded and board approval followed.

Treasurer Report: Ed Goetz reported that there is currently an account balance of \$10,037 in the bank. The amount of \$468 was allotted for newsletter printing; \$115 for its postage. Jim Cwierley made a motion to approve, seconded by Connie Holovics and board approval was granted.

Membership Report: In the absence of Lynn Getzin, Ed Goetz reported that we currently have 615 paid members.

President's Report: Rick VonLangen reported he had received a letter from a neighbor regarding an abandoned property at 70 Rockdale Drive. He will forward this to the Town for review.

We welcomed Thomas Johnson from *The Ride For Roswell* who spoke about how a portion of the ride will travel along Denrose and Willow Ridge. Up to 4,000 bicyclists will travel through the neighborhood on June 22. The ride starts at 7 a.m. and runs till 1 p.m. Police and volunteers will be present to ensure a safe ride. If you have questions or want to volunteer, please call Thomas Johnston at 845-3945 or email him at thomas.johntson@roswellpark.org.

There was also discussion about the need for the lawn to be moved near the corner of Willow Ridge and Sweetwood, at the Willow Ridge sign. Jim Cwierley will reach out to the Town.

Old Business: Tom Amodeo reported details about the planned movie night on July 19. Tom is working on sponsorship and has been having some discussion regarding insurance.

Rick reminded attendees that that there are still board, sales, and directory positions available.

Joe Battaglia reported that the Willow Ridge Garage Sale will take place June 28, 29 & 30. Please call Joe at 564-0737 and leave a message if you would like to have your home added to the map.

Lynn Mancuso discussed her idea for a free library near Willow Ridge Drive. She has made a request for funds to support this project. While the committee is interested, Lynn was asked to bring back more details before a decision is made.


New Business:

Bits & Bytes

So, you're getting back from your son's or daughter's graduation and you look at your phone, digital camera or video camera to find tons of pictures and videos. A job well done. You captured everything. So, where do you store these cherished moments? On your computer? On a flash drive? Maybe, you have an external hard drive just for this reason. If you don't have a backup solution, you are in the majority. This is becoming a growing problem. Technology made it easier to snap 500 pictures, but didn't give us an easy technology to safely store all of it. My advice to you is, invest in a Polaroid camera!!! Just kidding. Although, there is some truth to the simplicity of that camera. No filters or re-do's, just that moment. But I digress.

With all this data, how do you store this data securely and save on cost? Well, there are many options out there. Companies like Carbonite, who offers real time syncing of whatever data you want at a low cost, is an option. However, you get what you pay for and these companies tend to take forever transferring the data from your PC. Plus, how do you trust someone to store your personal information without ever having met them. The same goes for iCloud, SkyDrive and others. We store very sensitive data in the Courts and a lot of money is spent to prevent any data loss. We have a zero tolerance for missing data. However, you don't need this type of security or fail safe to protect your data. Here are some quick tips to get your data securely and inexpensively stored.

Unless you a technically inclined, I would stay away from trying to create an array of hard drives and have them mirror each other. There are some great products out there for this called NAS devices. (Network-attached Storage). These products give you the illusion of an external hard drive and you can drag all of your data to this drive from

your computer. What's happening behind the scenes, without any intervention, is a backup process. Most of these devices have "mirroring" capabilities. This means that whatever you copy to it, another drive is copying all the same information as well. If one drive happens to fail, the other drive will have all the data. Data would have been lost without this system. Want some tech terms for a dinner party? This is called a RAID 1 solution. These devices can range from \$199 to \$2000 for the consumer line. However, you will find most around the \$300-\$500 range.

Ok, you don't want to spend that kind of money. I get it. The cost of produce has gotten ridiculous. The goal is to keep data on at least two separate hard drives. So, if you already have your computer and then purchase an external hard drive, you are doing the same thing as the above listed solution except you have to copy everything manually. You will copy once to the main hard drive and then again to the external. If you are savvy you can set up a scheduled task on your PC to automate this copy process. A free tool is called robocopy. Google It. If this all sounds like too much work, just know that recovering lost data on failed disks is possible, but can be very expensive. This can easily be prevented by having two locations to store your data. Or keep it simple and buy a disposable camera. That's the advice my father would give you.
