



WRCA Minutes January 9, 2013

President Rick VonLangen called the meeting to order at 7:35 p.m. Also present were Vice President James Cwierley, Treasurer Ed Goetz, and Secretary Dawn Cwierley. Board members present were Mark Hammer, Connie Holovics, Tom Amodeo, and Carol Zaffram. Community attendees included Lynn Getzin, Membership Chair, Debby VonLangen, Wind-in-the-Willows editor, Michael Henel, Deanne Henel, Elizabeth Bechtel, Evan Wysacni, Andrew Neubert, Susan Neubert, Agnes Starr, Paul Bluestein, Matt Clemens, Kevin Schnirel, Barbara Stewart, David Stewart, Anthony Day, David Lovering, Sandy Radens and John Radens.

Secretary Minutes: A motion was made by Jim Cwierley to approve the secretary minutes from the December meeting. Ed Goetz seconded and board approval followed.

Treasurer Report: Ed Goetz reported that there is currently an account balance of \$12,192 in the bank. The amount of \$462 was allotted for newsletter printing, \$115 for its postage, and \$150 for the newsletter editor. Jim Cwierley made a motion to approve, seconded by Connie Holovics and board approval was granted.

Membership Report: Lynn Getzin reported that we currently have 534 paid members, which is 100 less than last year. A post card will be sent to all Willow Ridge residents to encourage their membership.

President's Report: Rick VonLangen reported that a list of volunteers had been distributed to the board members. At the next meeting, we will discuss how to best work with these individuals. A thank you was extended to those who participated in the holiday decorating contest.

Old Business: Jim Cwierley reported that responses to the event survey have slowed down. As a follow up to those responses, Tom Amodeo was following up on the idea of a family movie night. More details will be announced at a future meeting.

Ed Goetz reported that \$750 has come in from directory ads.

Rick will follow up with Home Depot regarding replacing the evergreen tree located at the entrance to Willow Ridge.

New Business:

Special guests Anthony Day, Superintendent of Sweet Home Schools and David Lovering, Principal of Willow Ridge Elementary, joined us for a timely and interesting presentation addressing school safety/violence, budget, teacher evaluations, and technology.

Subject of safety was of most intrigue since the Connecticut shootings. Mr. Day reviewed the school's drill procedures, discussed relationship with Town of Amherst Police Department, and addressed parents' questions about safety protocol at the schools. Mr. Lovering discussed students' reactions to the shootings and the way in which the school dealt with it.

Rick VonLangen reported that there is still an open board position available. Residents are encouraged to reach out to him to discuss their interest. The February 12 meeting will include Barry Weinstein, MD, Town of Amherst Supervisor. Please come prepared with questions to address with him.

Committee Reports: The Annual Wine Tasting event, hosted by Butler's Wine and Spirits at Classics V, will be on January 26. Proceeds benefit the scholarship fund. The Snowflake Dinner Dance is on March 2.

Open Forum: Vacant and foreclosed properties were discussed. Neighbors are encouraged to reach out to the town regarding these properties to ensure reports are filed.

There was also a discussion about block representative recruitment of members and why it was abandoned. The block rep system is being reevaluated.

Adjournment: With no further items on the agenda, a motion was made by Connie Holovics and seconded by Jim Cwierley to adjourn at 8:45 p.m. The next meeting is Tuesday, February 12, at the Ellicott Creek Fire Hall at 7:30 p.m. All Willow Ridge residents are welcome.
