WRCA Minutes February 14, 2012 President Ed Goetz called the meeting to order at 7:32 p.m. Also present were Vice President Karen Tyno, Treasurer Rick VonLangen, and Secretary Dawn Cwierley. Board members present were Debbie Goetz, Mark Hammer, Carol Zaffram, Connie Holovics and James VanSplunder. Community attendees included Jim Neubert, Ben Riocopio, Heidimarie Kunz, Cheryl Pauly, and Barbara R. Gilday.

Secretary Minutes: A motion was made by Jim Cwierley to approve the secretary minutes from the January meeting. Karen Tyno seconded and board approval followed.

Treasurer Report: Rick VonLangen reported that the Wine Tasting in January made a profit. The last bill for the Halloween party just arrived and was paid. There is currently an account balance of \$12,962. Debbie Goetz made a motion to approve, seconded by Jim Cwierley and board approval was granted.

President's Report: Ed Goetz reported that there had been some complaints regarding the wait at the Willow Ridge/Niagara Falls Boulevard traffic signal he has written a letter regarding this problem to the town and will report back to the committee of any response and or changes.

Old Business: Jim Cwierley reported that a total of 50 people, 13 of which are Willow Ridge residents, have signed up for the Community Emergency Response Team training. Once classes are complete, the subject of expanding the CERT team's responsibilities to include crime watch will be discussed.

New Business: Katy Duggan-Haas from Modern Corporation presented details regarding changes to recycling and garbage disposal. Goal of changes are to increase recycling, reduce waste, reduce costs, and maintain compliance with all applicable laws. Starting in



April, all Willow Ridge homes will receive a 65-gallon wheeled cart for single stream recycling, which will allow for more items to be recycled. See the flyer sent to homes for details specifics. Watch for details for Reward for Recycling Program to encourage more recycling. The collection schedule has changed and there is no collection in federal holidays.

Ed Goetz reported on the printing and delivery of the Willow Ridge directories. The Boy Scouts will deliver directories in March. Ed noted that there continues to be a problem with keeping the directory updated. While the goal is to include everyone in the neighborhood. many neighbors have not updated their information causing inaccurate information in the directory. Neighbors are urged to help the committee to ensure accuracy. It was decided that a special committee will be assembled to review the directory information in detail for next year's edition.

Committee Reports: The annual Wine Tasting event held on January 28 made \$1,829. Monies will be allocated to the playground fund (\$600) and scholarship fund (\$1,200). The Snowflake Dinner Dance will take place at Classics V on March 3. Mark Hammer also mentioned an interest in creating a German Fest in October.

Open Forum: Community members questioned Wal-Mart's responsibility for the upkeep and maintenance of the neighboring Chestnut Ridge property. They continue to be responsible for their half and Home Depot for the other side.

Adjournment: With no further items on the agenda, a motion was made by Mark Hammer and seconded Jim Cwierley to adjourn at 8:35 p.m. The next meeting is Tuesday, March 13, at the Ellicott Creek Fire Hall at 7:30 p.m. All Willow Ridge residents are welcome.
