



WRCA MINUTES September 12, 2012

President Ed Goetz called the meeting to order at 7:35 p.m. Also present were Vice President Karen Tyno, Treasurer Rick VonLangen. Board members present were Jim Cwierley, Debbie Goetz, Bill VanSplunder, Carol Zaffram and Connie Holovics. Also in attendance were Lynn Getzin, Membership Chair and Tom Amodeo.

Secretary Minutes: A motion was made by Karen Tyno to approve the secretary minutes from the June meeting. Jim Cwierley seconded and board approval followed.

Treasurer Report: Rick VonLangen reported that there is currently \$10,515.22 in the bank. Bills for editor, printing, and National Night Out have all been paid. Jim Cwierley made a motion to approve, seconded by Karen Tyno and board approval was granted.

President's Report: Ed Goetz had nothing to report.

Old Business: National Night out was attended by over 286 individuals. John Miller and Bob Sieman did a great job coordinating the event. It was discussed how well the event is attended and enjoyed by all.

President Ed Goetz discussed that many of the board members terms are up in December and asked if they would be returning. Six will be returning, three will not, one member was not present, and there was one new volunteer. Carol Zaffram offered to reach out to the Willow Ridge PTA and the Boy Scouts to explain the association and the need for volunteers. It was also requested that Ed Goetz discuss the Association in his monthly letter.

Membership: Lynn Getzin asked for board approval of the membership invoice. Board approval was granted. All households in the neighborhood will be sent a *Wind-in-the-Willows* and an invoice for the month of October. The board also discussed printing email addresses in the directory. It was voted unanimously not to print them.

The Junior Recreation Committee noted that the Children's Halloween Party will be Saturday, October 27, 2012 from 12:30 to 2:30 at Willow Ridge Elementary.

Jim Cwierley reported that the CERT team is formally under way creating their disaster response plan. Jim also mentioned that there will be information forthcoming regarding a neighborhood watch program.

New events within the association were discussed at length. Currently, no new events are planned. It was suggested working with Average Joe's for a pay one price Octoberfest as the Town of Amherst has not been able to give a firm response about using Bedford Park for this event. Several ideas were mentioned for the future events and various board members are willing to look into these ideas. It was also discussed that the board put a survey together asking the community what type of events they would like to see.

Keep the Kids Safe!

Local school kids are back to school. The WRCA reminds drivers to be extra vigilant and drive smart in residential areas and school zones. A few reminders to help keep your kids safe while walking and biking to and school. Please ask them to:

- · Always cross the street with an adult until age 10
- · Cross the street at corners using traffic signals & cross-walks
- · Look left, right and left again prior to crossing
- · Wear bright or reflective clothing to increase visibility
- · Always walk, never run when crossing streets
- · Walk on sidewalks or paths
- · Walk facing traffic or as far away from the road as possible if there are no sidewalks
- · Never run out into the street or cross between parked cars
- · Reduce distractions Stay Alert! Don't text or keep headphones on while walking
- · If riding a bike, scooter or skateboard, ALWAYS wear the appropriate helmet walk, don't ride across the street and use hand signals

For parents and drivers:

- · Slow down & be alert in residential areas and school zones
- · Reduce distractions inside your car
- Be sure all the riders in your vehicle are properly restrained, everyone should have their own seat belt
- Remember, children under 13 are safer in the back seat, and it's the law.
