



Agenda - Order of business:

Guest Speaker: Anthony Day Superintendent of Sweet Home Schools, gave a presentation of the problems and issues Sweet Home Schools will face in the coming years. His 35 minute presentation focused on the lack of state aid for SHCSD, budget constraints and attempts to rectify the approximately \$3.3 million dollar shortfall being faced for the coming year. Treasurer's Report: Ed Goetz reporting for Rick VonLangen - expenses for November were \$118.00, income was: \$2862.00 leaving an account balance of: \$12,121. Pat Land made a motion to approve, Dawn Cwierley seconded board approval was unanimous.

Old Business: The WRCA is looking for a resident to fill the open post of Junior Recreation director. If anyone is interested please contact President Ed Goetz. The CERT program is moving forward, if anyone is interested please contact Dawn Cwierley.
