



WRCA MINUTES

April 14, 2009

This meeting was held at the Villas on Chestnut Ridge community center.

President Bob Foladare called the meeting to order at 7:30 p.m. In attendance were President Bob Foladare, Vice President Ed Goetz, Secretary Pat Land, Treasurer Jack Baker; Board Members Karen Tyno, John Cowden, Joe Battaglia, and John Radens. Excused were Board Members Jim Prentice, and Clayton Cobb. In the gallery were Cam Hill, Kerri Jasen, Lee Baker, Sandy Radens, and Mara Lansing.

The secretary's minutes from March were reviewed and a motion was made by Ed Goetz and seconded by Karen Tyno to accept said minutes. A board approval followed.

Treasurer's Report

Treasurer Jack Baker reported that all expenses were met from February and March. March expenses were \$1704.00, March income was \$759.00, with an account balance of \$7286.00. A motion was made by Ed Goetz and seconded by Karen Tyno to approve the treasurer's report, and the board unanimously approved. Jack also reported that we do not have an approval yet on the WRCA status as a 501c4 organization.

President's Report

Bob Foladare reported that a number of residents have called to complain about deer roaming through the Willow Ridge neighborhood. Since it seems that the deer have been extremely active, Bob emphasized that everyone should drive with caution and be watchful for deer.

Membership Report

Membership Director Kerri Jasen stated that 803 paid renewals have been received. This number represents 94% of her goal of 850 members for 2009. Kerri is in need of 11 block reps and 2 head reporters. Hopefully she will get some volunteers to help out and contribute their talents to our community. Anyone interested should contact her.

Youth Recreation (John Cowden) John reported that the Easter Party was a great success with 70 children in attendance. John wishes to give special thanks to Girl Scout Troops 304 and 1420 for their assistance with the party. Garage Sale Chairman (John Cowden) John reported that the annual garage sale is set for the weekend of June 19, 20, and 21. More information will be forthcoming. Old Business

Sweet Home athletic director, the building and grounds supervisor and Willow Ridge principal have all granted permission for the annual sprucing up of the Willow Ridge School ball diamonds on Saturday, April 25, 8:30 a.m. with a rain date of May 2. Volunteers are needed; all are welcome to help spruce up the diamonds for our neighborhood youth to enjoy. The meeting place is Bedford Park diamond.

New Business

Representatives John Stafford from WalMart and Rob-Bertone from Home Depot along with their attorney, Vince Hanley, were present to ask for the WRCA Board approval to continue with the seasonal garden centers at their locations. A discussion ensued about both companies duties to our neighborhood, such as sidewalk snow plowing and cleanup of their respective properties bordering our neighborhood. Both companies and store managers agreed to implement better plans to facilitate this work. They further stated that they would meet with us regularly to follow up on these actions. In the spirit of fostering good neighborhood partners, the board voted and agreed to extend the garden center agreements for 1 year contingent on both companies following through on their promises. Both representatives asked that if any Willow Ridge residents see any issues with the WalMart or Home Deport properties, to please contact a WRCA board member who in turn will take the issues to them for correction.

A discussion led by Treasurer Jack Baker ensued as to the changing of the WRCA fiscal year. At the present our fiscal year runs from January 1 to December 31. By changing our fiscal year to run form July 1 to June 30, a number of benefits are derived. A few are: all expenses will be incurred in the same year, as well as income. 
