Kerri is in need of 11 block reps and 3 head reporters. Hopefully she will get some volunteers to help out and contribute their talents to our community. Anyone interested should contact her.

Garage Sale Chairman (John Cowden) John reported that the annual garage sale is set for the weekend of June 19, 20, and 21. This year's sale should be even bigger than last year's.

National Night Out Jim Prentice will contact John Miller about National Night Out to be held in August.


