April 8, 2008

A call to order was made by Jim Prentice at 7:37 p.m. to start the meeting of the WRCA Board for April. Also in attendance was Kerri Jasen, to deliver membership funds, and in the gallery were Jack and Lee Baker, as well as Ben Procopio, who will do the independent auditing of the books again this year. The secretary's minutes from the March meeting was reviewed and a motion was made to approve the minutes by Ed Goetz and a second was made by John Cowden, followed by a board approval.

**Treasurer's Report:**

The treasurer's report was brought forth by Treasurer Ed Goetz. Mr. Goetz reported that all expenses for the period had been paid in full. Ed also reported that additional expenses for the Easter party, the ball park upgrade, scholarship monies and web page were distributed.
