



# WRCA MINUTES June 10, 2008

President Jim Prentice called the meeting to begin at 7:36 p.m. In attendance were Jim Prentice, Bob Foladare, Ed Goetz, Clayton Cobb, John Cowden, John Radens, Pat Land and Cam Hill. In the gallery were Lee Baker, Jack Baker, Neil Cuomo and Gary Roussi. There were also many other interested Willow Ridge residents in attendance. The secretary's minutes from May's meeting were read and a motion was made to approve the minutes by Bob Foladare. A second was made by Pat Land, followed by a board approval.

President Jim Prentice started the meeting with the introduction of John Gerkin, the campaign manager for Jon Powers. Mr. Powers, who was scheduled to be at the meeting to speak and answer questions about his current quest for a congressional seat in the 26th district, could not attend due to an unscheduled trip to the west coast. Mr. Gerkin gave a brief description of Mr. Power's qualifications and vision for his possible seat in Washington. He also answered many questions concerning pressing national issues.

Michelle Anello then was given the floor to also state her qualifications for a state legislator position. She also answered questions about certain state spending problems about which she is passionate. If Willow Ridge residents want more specific information about each candidate they can visit the websites of each candidate.

#### **Treasurer's Report:**

Treasurer Ed Goetz reported that all monies have been collected from the membership drive. He also reported that all expenses for the period were paid and up to date. Mr. Goetz gave an update on the progress of the application of the 501 C-3 which will allow the WRCA to be a tax exempt organization. He reported that the application has been completed and that the fee had been paid. He stated the process takes 90-120 days to complete. He also revealed to the board that the WRCA will now have to file a yearly tax return required by such a tax status. A motion was to approve the report by Pat Land, with a second from Bob Foladare. The report was accepted. **President's Report:** 

President Jim Prentice brought forth a concern of who was responsible for the grass around the pumping station and along the curb areas on Chestnut Ridge. The board will investigate and communicate with the proper company.
