WRCA BYLAWS CHANGE

In order to maintain the functional integrity of the Board of Directors of the Willow Ridge Civic Association, the Board is presenting the following Amendment to the WRCA Bylaws. It is proposed that Item 10 of Article VII—Board of Directors, be reworded as follows:

Current Item 10 of Article VII:

10. A director may be removed when sufficient cause exists for such removal. The Board of Directors may entertain charges against any director. A director may be represented by counsel upon any removal hearing. The Board of Directors shall adopt such rules as it may n its discretion consider necessary for the best interests of the organization, for this hearing.

Suggested Item 10 of Article VII:

10. In the event that a director exceeds two unexcused absences from regularly scheduled Board meetings, said director will be considered as having resigned that Board position and will be replaced as described above. Directors are expected to notify the President of meeting attendance is not possible.

This amendment to the WRCA Bylaws requires a 2/3 majority of members present at the November 11, 2008 meeting of the Willow Ridge Civic Association.
