#### **SECRETARY'S MINUTES**

#### **TREASURER'S REPORT**

Treasurer Ed Goetz reported that Ben Procopio had completed his audit of the WRCA financial records. Jim reported that the PTO is looking for fundraising ideas as well as possible financial help from the WRCA. President Prentice raised the topic of the WRCA "wish list" that the Town of Amherst had asked for. 
