WRCA Meeting Minutes Meeting September 11, 2007

The WRCA board reconvened after its summer break. A call to order was made by Jim Prentice at 7:35 pm. In attendance were Jim Prentice, Bob Foladare, Ed Goetz, Clayton Cobb, Cam Hill (past president), Pat Land, Bill Pujolas, Kerri Jasen, Jill Hagan and Joe Battaglia. In the gallery were Ben Procopio, John Cowden, Neil Cuomo, Gary Roussie, Jack Baker, Lee Baker, Rick and Debby VonLangen.

The secretary's minutes from the June meeting were reviewed and a motion was made to approve the minutes by Bob Foladare and a second was made by Ed Goetz, followed by a board approval.

Treasurer's Report:

The treasurer's report was brought forth by Treasurer Ed Goetz. Ed reported that membership income collected had exceeded last year. He also communicated that there is still some uncollected income from directory ads that will hit this month's balance sheet. Ed stated that all expenses for WRCA summer activities had been met and the overall fiscal strength of the WRCA was strong. A motion was made by Bob Foladare to accept the report followed by a second from Pat Land. The board voted to accept the report.

President's Report:

WRCA's president, Jim Prentice reported that he had not received any new correspondence in recent weeks. He did have Bob Foladare share the thank you letters from the recipients of the WRCA scholarships this year. Jim lead a brief discussion on reorganizing services that the WRCA provides and a decision was made to have a summit on the matter following the board meeting.

Membership Report:

Membership director Kerri Jasen reported that 862 households had become members or renewed WRCA membership this year and that membership was up from the goal. Kerri also stated that there are a few needs at the block rep. and head reporter position. Kerri communicated that she is working on a stronger line of communication for all concerned with the membership drive process therefore making it more efficient and resident friendly.

Old Business:

Bob Foladare gave his report on the final dealings with American Campus. He stated that the funds promised to the WRCA and the other associations involved will soon be awarded.

New Business:

President Jim Prentice expanded on the earlier discus-

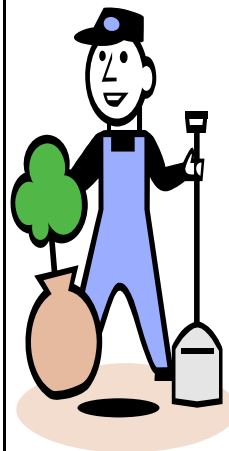
