Membership Drive 2018-Why Should I Join?

hen we moved here 35 years ago, almost every household belonged. Sadly, this is no longer true. Through the years, perhaps all the new residents in Willow Ridge do not know the importance of a continuing homeowner's association. Hopefully this update will explain how a strong membership benefits your family.

A civic association is a type of organization whose official goal is to improve neighborhoods through the dues and volunteer work of its members. Dues go back into the community to provide the many recreational activities for our children such as the Halloween party, Easter party, and all the fun for the younger members during National Night Out in the summer. We coordinate the outdoor family movie night with the Town held in Bedford Park in August. There are several annual events for adults also, the Snowflake Dinner Dance and Wine Tasting Event. Although dues money is not used for these events, a share of the tickets is used to fund the yearly scholarships given to two Willow Ridge high school seniors each year. We also promote the springtime neighborhood garage sale and provide refreshments for organized groups of neighbors to clean up our green spaces during the warm weather and for those who join us for our holiday tree lighting at the corner of Willow Ridge Drive and Sweetwood. While these social events give us the opportunity to share the happy times with our neighbors, not everyone has children, time so socialize, or is even interested in attending these things. However, there is so much more to being a Willow Ridge Civic Association member that our social events.

he most important service that WRCA provides our neighborhood affects every single homeowner who lives in Willow Ridge. For most of us, one of the biggest investments we make is purchasing our home. Maintaining and improving the value invested in a home purchase is very important for all of us. When a neighborhood starts experiencing problems that impact our bottom financial line, we all face losing some of the equity we have built up through home ownership. Working on keeping Willow Ridge the sought after and desirable neighborhood it is known as has always been the most important service the Willow Ridge Civic Association has provided.

During the past ten months, we have been actively facing many issues that have the potential to negatively affect our property values. The installation of cell towers in our backyards, the development of new apartment complexes in the backyards of homeowners, the "zombie" houses left by the banks that are not maintained, the traffic issues resulting in pedestrian deaths on Niagara Falls Boulevard, these are the bigger problems we have been addressing. The potholes, falling trees and rowdy renters are ongoing issues we address. While WRCA is not a politically partisan organization, nonetheless, we need to work with town government on resolving issues in the best interests for Willow Ridge. Member or not, everyone who lives benefits from the hard work put in by the WRCA to achieve the best results of all of us.

Sidewalk Snow Clearing Contractor List

For Residents

he Town of Amherst currently provides a Sidewalk Snow Relief Program which assists residents who are located in two special districts that have exceptional hardships in clearing their sidewalks during winter months by providing snow relief services. This helps ensure that sidewalks are clear and safe for use by pedestrians in accordance with Town Code 83-9-5. The Town's Sidewalk Snow Relief Committee continues to receive requests from residents and neighborhoods for sidewalk snow clearing services, but it is not possible for the Town to include all requests in its current program.

Therefore, the Town has created a list of sidewalk snow clearing contractors who are willing and able to contract with property owners to clear snow on private sidewalks during winter months. The list can be accessed by using the link below. This list is continuously updated as contractor requests are received.

The Town does not recommend contractors. The list of contractors is simply made available to residents who may then contact individual companies to contract for sidewalk snow clearing services. The Town is not involved and does not have any responsibility beyond forming, maintaining, and making the list available to residents. Any agreements or contracts regarding

pricing, hours, etc. would be between the resident and the contractor, and would not involve the Town. It is recommended that residents get more than one quote from various contractors and inquire about contractors having up-to-date insurance.




