I have asked the town for garbage totes to be placed at the convenience store, the parking lot on the corner of Joe McCarthy Drive and Willow Ridge Drive and over by 7-11. The hope is it will cut down on the garbage that collects in that area.



Here is a little info on the Buffalo Walk/Fun Run for Chiari. The 1 mile event will take place Saturday September 22nd at Ellicott Creek Park in Tonawanda. Registration begins at 12:00. Walk/run begins at 1:30.

My little girl Haley in the pic below was diagnosed with Chiari and Syringomyelia. I am still trying to process this in my mind but I do want you to know that your support is so greatly appreciated. This research is so desperately needed.



Chiari is a serious neurological disorder that affects over 300,000 people in the US in which the brain herniates through the skull putting pressure on the nerves and spinal cord disrupting the normal flow of cerebrospinal fluid causing debilitating pain and life threatening symptoms.

Syringomyelia often accompanies Chiari and presents as a a syrinx (a fluid filled pocket in the spine) that can lead to paralysis.

There is no cure for Chiari. There is only a risky brain and spine decompression surgery that many times fails, needs revision after revision, or worse. I line the walk path with over 200 laminated pictures of people just in my small social circle that I know of that have passed due to Chiari. Some didn't have surgery, many did have surgery, multiple surgeries, and are no longer with us. The decision to have or not have surgery weighs heavily on those affected and the parents of those affected. We just want the best possible outcome and with that we need research and a better way.

The last few years have been exciting for us! Not only did Mayor Byron Brown, Senator Ranzenhofer, and Governor Cuomo all sign proclamations recognizing September as Chiari Awareness Month but the Peace Bridge and Niagara Falls both turned purple for Chiari which is a huge step for awareness! I received confirmation that the Peace Bridge, the Electric Tower, and Niagara Falls will all be lighting up for us once again on the evening of the walk 9/22/2018.



Walk Activities include: Sponge Bob Square Pants, Dora, Spiderman, and your favorite Princesses will be making appearances. Billy Buffalo from the Bills has been known to pop in. DJ Mike Setlock from Mix 96 will be playing music. The Midnight Kings will be our live band. Facepainting, Balloon animals, chair massages, my daughter Haley's Girl Scout Troop does tattoos and nail painting. Fire Trucks and Ambulances demos. Ted's hot dogs, popcorn, snow-cones, cotton candy. Bonefish Grill will be serving their Bang Bang Shrimp and Blackberry Smash! Large basket raffle and 50/50.

Duke University trained pediatric neurosurgeon Dr. Renee Reynolds from UB Neurosurgery will be this year's walk guest speaker!

o date, the Buffalo site has raised more than \$135,000.00 with the support of our local businesses. Money raised from walks around the country enabled Conquer Chiari in 2012 to open the first research facility in the country dedicated to Chiari, Syingomyelia, brain & spinal cord injuries at the University of Akron in Ohio; fund research grants and an annual conference where neurosurgeons and experts in the field present their findings; and enabled Conquer Chiari to start the first database following long term outcomes of surgical and non surgical patients.

Dear Neighborhood Stakeholder:

Amherst's neighborhoods are the building blocks of our community. It is important to reach out to our residents and understand the valued characteristics and opportunities facing these areas; it is essential for effective community planning. In 1998, the Town conducted a series of meetings in many neighborhoods. An outcome of these meetings was a "to do" list for the Town, County, and State agencies. These meetings also became the impetus for re-envisioning the Town's Comprehensive Plan, a plan that was a guide for our community through its Bicentennial in 2018.

Over the last 20 years, the Town has matured and developed, our housing market has evolved, the way we shop for goods and services has changed, our community services have become more important and the costs to deliver these services has increased, and quality of life issues have come to the forefront. The Town faces the next decade as a mostly built out community that needs to invigorate and reinvent its commercial centers and business parks and build on its recreational and open space assets, while recognizing the importance of preserving and protecting community character.

Planning for our future is a dynamic process that never stops. As the new Town Board begins its journey in governance, it is a good time to return to our neighborhoods and our residents to understand where we are now and the direction we should be heading into the future. The Town also needs to recommit to the neighborhoods to ensure that it is keeping pace with changing community needs, as a whole, and making the best decisions for the Town. But, we cannot do this alone.

To help the Town identify important issues and opportunities in the neighborhoods, a series of ten (10) *Neighborhood Forums* have been scheduled. These forums provide a chance for Town representatives to meet with residents and property owners to discuss existing conditions, examine local issues and concerns, and to recognize opportunities for improvement. It is hoped that by conducting these forums, the Town can establish the foundational "civic infrastructure" for continuing conversations into the future and gathering the public input necessary to keep the neighborhoods in the Town strong, quality places to live. Additional information on these Neighborhood Forums can be found on the Town's website at www.amherst.ny.us.

We are calling on active organizations and stakeholders in your neighborhood to help us make these meetings a useful and worthwhile endeavor. We are asking you to help us spread the word by posting this information in a newsletter and online and bringing people out to provide their input. Without local input, land use planning efforts and decisions are, for the most part, left up to the Town. We want you to help us plan for your future.

A Neighborhood Forum has been scheduled for the Ellicott Creek community at 6:30pm on Monday, May 14 2018 at the Ellicott Creek Fire Hall upstairs in the Banquet Hall (45 South Ellicott Creek Road). We hope you will attend and find this event a valuable way for the Town to establish a stronger connection with your neighborhood and a better means for identifying local concerns. We are excited to have the opportunity to meet with residents and others, so we hope that you can assist us with our outreach to make these Neighborhood Forums a successful endeavor.


