The on-line alternative will be via PayPal, a secure method to make your payment via your computer. There will be a link via the WRCA website. If paying by PayPal, please be sure to fill out and the submit the form on the link, to ensure that your information for the 2022 directory is accurate.

Membership dues are \$20.00 and are due by December 31, 2021.

Your timely membership payment ensures that you will receive the Wind-in-the-Willows, Emailed Updates and that the 2022 WRCA Directory will be delivered to your house. April 2022 is our target date for delivery.

WILLOW RIDGE COMMUNITY DIRECTORY FOR THE YEAR 2021

t is time to begin putting the Willow Ridge Community Directory together again and you are invited to place an advertisement in the 2022 edition. Our directory will carry your advertising message into the homes of the community you serve in a handy 5 1/2 x 8 1/2 booklet that is kept, read, and used for a full year by our Willow Ridge residents.

The directory (published in the spring of each year) lists the names, addresses and telephone numbers of more than 1,200 families who live in the Willow Ridge area. Residents rely on it to contact neighbors and committees and to locate local goods and services. The directory is especially useful to those who are just moving into the area.

Prices are based on "camera-ready" copy (clear, black and white copies of a previous ad or one from another publication the same size as the one you wish to place in our directory. Typesetting will be extra. Minor changes are free. You may obtain quotes or help in setting up your ad by calling the Directory Chairperson. Full page ads are \$150.00, half pages are \$85.00, and quarter pages are \$55.00.

Ads that are purchased and paid by February 15th will receive a 10 % discount. Ads will be placed in the directory in the order of receipt from front to back.

Many advertisers find our coupons to be helpful in generating business. We offer a coupon free of charge with any half or full-page ad. (Quarter page advertisers can place a coupon in the directory for a \$4.00 fee). By offering a discount or special price for your goods or services, you draw attention to your advertisement. Coupons appear in a special tear-out section while your paid advertisement remains in the directory throughout the year.

Some ideas to add to our already growing list of advertisers are electricians, heating/air conditioning companies, dental, gardening, plumbing, personal care such as barber shops, hair salons and nail care.
