Another Chance to Save Money (and maybe your life!)

The NYS Defensive Driving Course, Accident Prevention Course, or Points Reduction Class is a comprehensive driver safety course which provides knowledge and techniques for safe and lawful driving. And we all want safer drivers on the road!

When you complete an approved defensive driving class, you receive a 10% reduction of the base rate of your auto and motorcycle insurance premiums each year for three years. That savings can amount to hundreds of dollars over 3 years for just one member of your family! You can also refresh your driving knowledge and reduce up to 4 points from your NYS DMV driving record if necessary. The 6-hour class covers essential information about traffic safety issues such as driver attitude and behavior, defensive driving techniques, and the Vehicle & Traffic Law. No formal testing is required to complete the course.

A class is being offered Sat., March 16th, from 9am to 3:45pm at Amherst Baptist Church at Willowridge & Peppertree. The cost is \$30 and includes a ½ hour lunch. 
