The April 9, 2019 WRCA meeting was called to order at 7:38 pm by President Erich Krueger.

In attendance were President Erich Krueger, Vice President Kristin Puff, Secretary Jane Sieman and Board Members John Radens, Marijean Nichols, Ann Nichols, Andy Annesi, and Cassandra Schwab. Excused was Treasurer. Donna Mosteller. Also in attendance were Town of Amherst Highway Superintendent, Patrick Lucey, Bob Lannen, Bill & Patty Lisk, Jim & Jane Steel, Darlene Wawrzyniec, Evelyn Hitchcock, Mark & Carmen Kelly, Nicholas Quilty-Koval, Mekhi Young, Dan Howarrd, Judy Kindron, Jerry Moran, Mark Valle, and Kori Cahill.

WRCA welcomed Town of Amherst Highway Superintendent Pat Lucey. Discussion was held regarding the roles/responsibilities of the highway department such as tree trimming, the ash tree situation in our town, street sweepers, storm drainage, mosquito baiting, parks maintenance/grounds and the refuse/garbage pickup which is contracted out to Modern Disposal. Yard waste will be picked up from April 1 to November 30. We thanked him for the placement of totes in the lot next to convenient and it has been noted that they are being used. Mr. Lucey spoke of the recycling costs and changes over the past years and mentioned that there will be an organic composting program available starting May 18th at the Farmer's Market

in Williamsville.

Another discussion was held regarding the plans for road paving this upcoming seasons and the proposed roads to be done in Willow Ridge are S Ellicott Creek Road, Hubbardston, Jonathan and McIntosh. Mr. Lucey noted how the price of asphalt affects the list of streets to be done. Right now there are 50 proposed streets out of 1000 streets in Amherst scheduled to be done this year.

Also discussed was street lighting. The street lights on Niagara Falls Blvd is to be started this year and there are plans for lights on Sweethome Rd from Maple to at least the 990 entrance in the works.

A power point presentation was given by Nicholas Quilty-Koval, Mekhi Young, and Mark Valle, SUNY Buffalo State students who have been conducting interviews and studies in Willow Ridge on demographics, zoning changes, traffic circulation and issues, etc. They will be holding a public presentation tentatively May 14th. More details will follow as the become available.

This discussion will be continued and guidelines set as we do our upcoming budget in the next two months.




Great Sadness



Spring Fun Facts -

he first day of spring is called the vernal equinox. The term vernal is Latin for "spring" and equinox is Latin for "equal night."

The fall and spring equinoxes are the only two times during the year when the sun rises due east and sets due west.


On the first day of spring, a person at the North Pole would see the sun skimming across the horizon, beginning six months of uninterrupted daylight. A person at the South Pole would see the sun skimming across the horizon, signaling the start of six months of darkness.



nring almost always arrives on March 20 or 21, but sometimes on the 19th. The reason the equinoxes and solstices don't always come on the same day is that Earth doesn't circle the sun in exactly 365 days. The first day of spring in the Southern Hemisphere is the first day of fall in the Northern Hemisphere. Holidays that occur in spring include Easter, Passover, April Fool's Day, Earth Day, Arbor Day, Mother's Day, Father's Day, Cinco De Mayo, and Holi (festival of colors in India).

One long-term study found that, at least in the Colorado Rocky Mountain region, spring begins, on average, about three weeks earlier than it did in the 1970s.
