ew Beginnings Food Pantry is ready for drive-through distribution this Saturday! Are you able and available to help during this unique time? Volunteers are needed at 9:00 Saturday morning. I texted Kathryn Turner Napoli "Hi Erich! Thanks for answering the call for volunteers on Saturday with the food pantry distribution. Would you please be in contact with Carol Young at your earliest convenience? She and her husband, John, are in charge of the pantry. I told her about you, so she is expecting to hear from you, and has further instructions for Saturday. Carol's email is wheatfieldmom@gmail.com I mentioned some of the questions about distributing food to elderly residents, and Carol has more information about how to best do that. If the pantry were just one funded by our church, we could more ably distribute as we desire. However, because they are a Food Bank of WNY/ Feed More pantry, they do have regulations they must abide by. That being said, they are very able and willing to help those in need. She did mention that the pantry at St. Christopher's likely also needs many volunteers as many of their regular volunteers are senior citizens. If you learn of desperate situations in the WR community, our deacons do have a benevolent fund that might be able to help, so keep that in mind as well.

Ellicott Creek Volunteer Fire Company

A Very Important Message from your Ellicott Creek Volunteer Fire Co. regarding COVID-19

he leadership of the Fire Company is in constant contact with Local, County and State Officials and receives the most up to date information available regarding this pandemic on a daily basis. All information that is received is reviewed thoroughly and is then disseminated to the First Responders clearly.

To keep our Firefighters and others safe. We have closed both of our Fire Stations at 45 South Ellicott Creek Road and 3000 Sweet Home Road to any and all visitors or the general public. Which means for the foreseeable future Members will only be allowed in the Stations.

During this time of uncertainty we ask if you require an ambulance, for any reason, please be patient with the dispatchers at our local dispatch centers. The dispatchers will ask a series of questions that allow us to better understand your medical needs and the required levels of protection that are needed to keep everyone in the community as safe as possible.

Depending on the symptoms that are described over the phone, when arriving on scene our crew may be in full protective equipment including masks, goggles and gowns. Please don't be alarmed by this extra layer of protective equipment, this is to protect you, our responders and the community as a whole.. They will enter your home as quickly as possible while making sure that extra precautions are taken and the equipment is correctly and safely put on. Once our first responders are on location they may ask you the same questions that were asked by the local dispatch center and request that you go into greater detail when answering. This is to ensure that the first responders on location have all of the correct and most up to date information regarding your incident and that it is handled safely for everyone involved..

Most importantly for the safety of the First Responders if you have already tested positive for COVID-19 or have had contact with someone that has tested positive for COVID -19 and are now in need of hospitalization we kindly ask that this information be transmitted to the local dispatch center when placing the call as well as to the representatives of every First Response agency that you encounter when rendering assistance to you or anyone with you. This is to ensure that you receive the most appropriate care in regards to your situation and to ensure that we keep our first responders safe to handle other emergency calls going forward.

Furthermore, if you need to be transported to a hospital we may not be able to honor your request as to which hospital to take you to. This decision may be made by Erie County Department of Health which determines the current capacity and capabilities of all of the hospitals and what could better suit your needs.

Please know that the volunteer members of our Fire Company are committed to serving the residents In a safe and efficient manner keeping you, our responders, and the community as safe as we can as we navigate through this unprecedented time.








Help the leprechaun get through this quatrefoil shaped maze.

Start from the top. Avoid locked doors.





National Grid Service Disconnection Scam

Recently some National Grid customers have been contacted by scammers posing as National Grid employees who seek to obtain personal/financial information by threatening disconnection. The calls are coming from an area code 315 (Syracuse) number, lending them a greater appearance of legitimacy. National Grid wanted to make the public aware of this situation, and offer some tips, in case any of customers are impacted.

A few quick tips from our friends at National Grid

- National Grid may ask for payment over the phone in a collection situation but will leave the method of payment up to the customer. National Grid will never demand immediate payment by wire transfer, Green Dot Money-Pak, or any other pre-paid card service.
- National Grid representatives will know your account number; never offer that
 information to a caller. Ask the caller to provide the last five digits of your National
 Grid account number. If the caller doesn't know your account number and/or you
 have any doubt the caller is a National Grid representative, hang up immediately
 and call National Grid directly.
- Every National Grid employee is required to carry a photo ID card, and any
 contractor doing work for the company is also required to carry ID. If someone is
 requesting entry into your home or business and does not have a valid ID and/or
 you have any doubts that they are a National Grid representative, do not let them
 in and contact National Grid and/or local authorities.
- If any of your constituents believe they are the targets of a scam, they should contact National Grid, their local law enforcement agency, and the Attorney General's office immediately. And if they are ever unsure of the legitimacy of a call they receive, they can always hang up and dial the number on their National Grid bill to ensure they are speaking to an actual National Grid representative.
