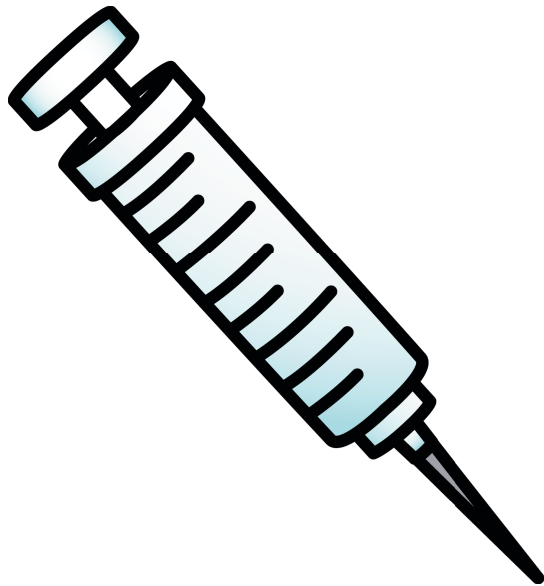
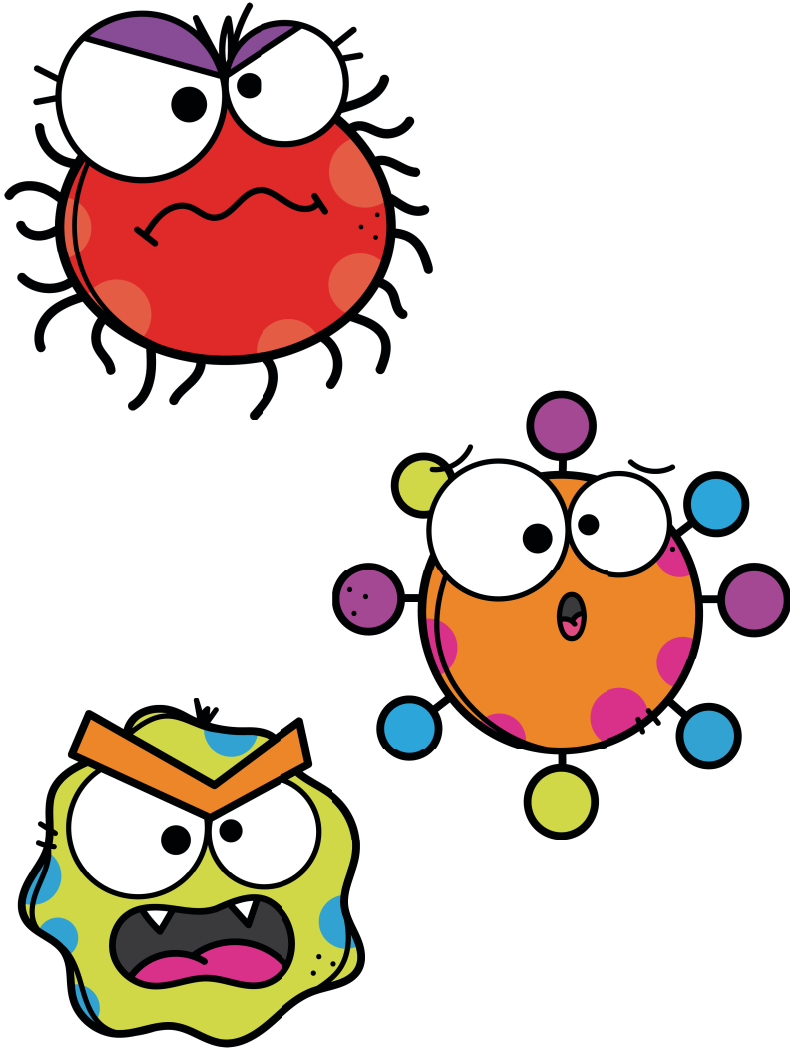


It's time to

A shot is also called a vaccination.



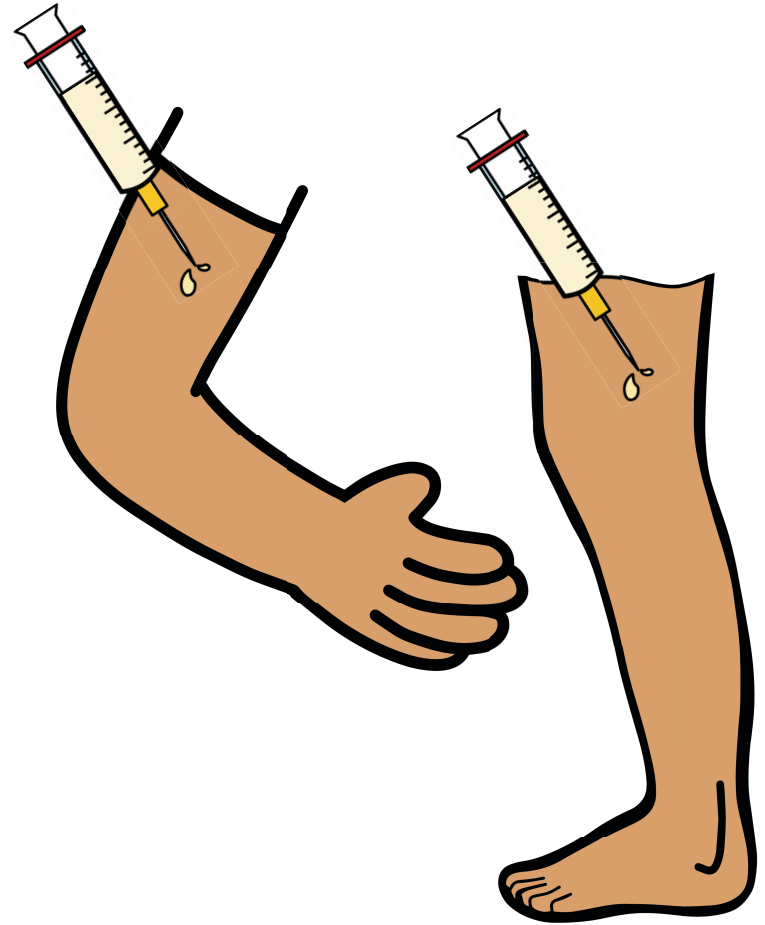
Shots help protect people

office or pharmacy to get a shot.



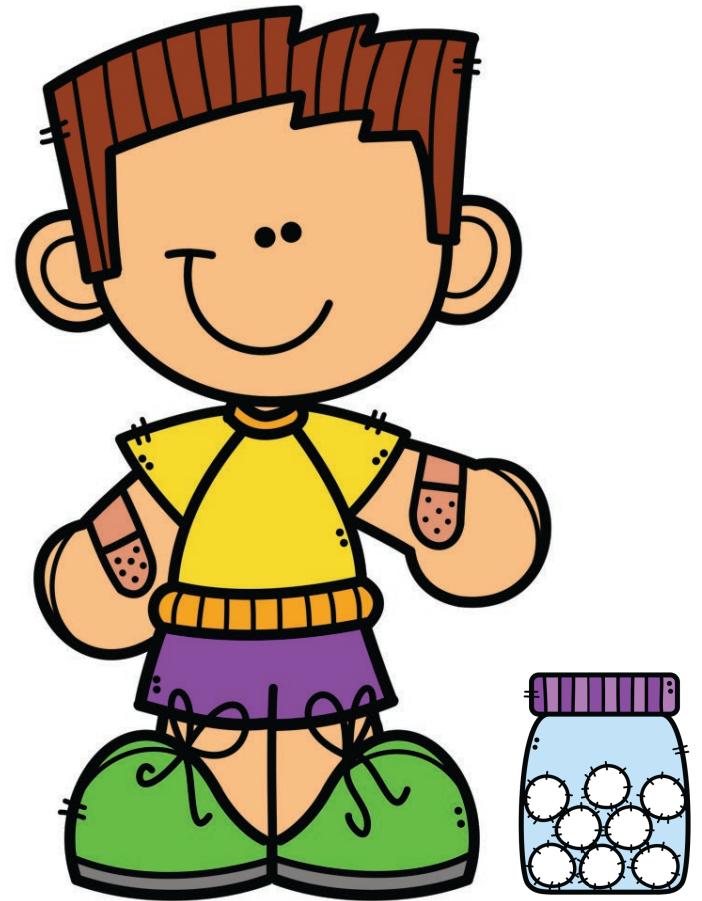
First, the doctor or nurse will rub my arm with a wipe that cleans my skin.



Then, they will put the shot in my arm with a needle. Sometimes the shot will go in the leg instead.



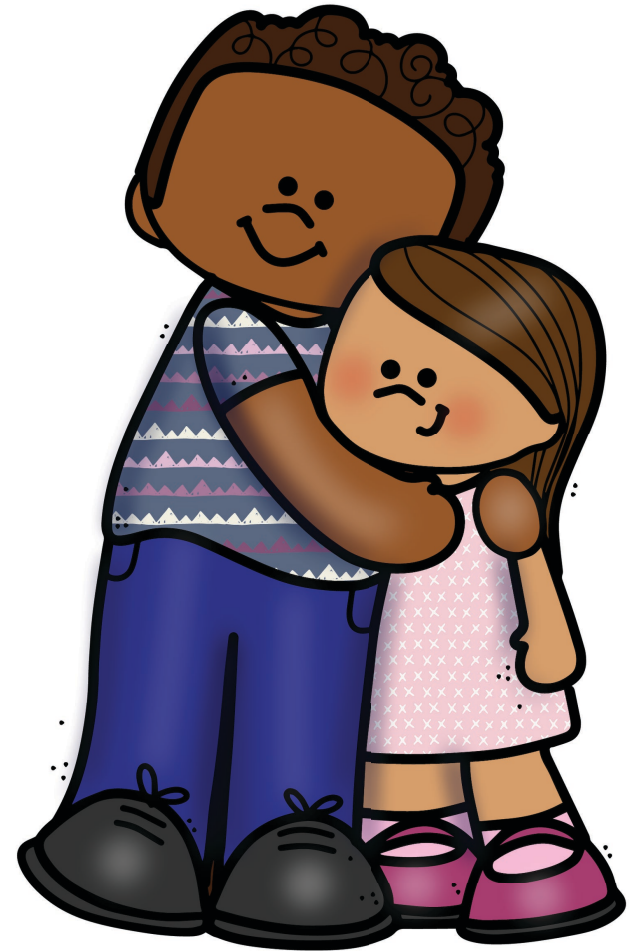
It will feel like a pinch when the
