***Your E-911 sign number is your address number.

Sign must be reflective GREEN background and 4" White numbers

o Numbers can be purchased at Ace Hardware in Brodheadsville 570-801-7880 and Country Junction in Lehighton 484-629-3629

o (Lowe's and Home Depot DO NOT have 4" numbers)

- Sign must be located at driveway entrance.
- Sign number must be on both sides and can be seen from 50 feet in both directions of the road
- Sign may be placed vertically or horizontally



- Sign may not be placed on an electric or utility pole
- Sign may be attached to the top of your mailbox, if your mailbox is at your driveway entrance
- Sign post must be on your property and 6' to 8' back from the road pavement
- Signs bottom edge must be 48" above ground level o Polk Township Ordinance NO. 2011-03 Adopted 6-27-11

1. MAILBOX must be shoveled out by the resident to receive mail delivery.



Simplified guidelines on the E- 911 NUMBER & STREET sign regulations. See Ordinance 2011-03 adopted on 6/27/2011 for complete information and guidelines.

Who? All occupied primary or seasonal homes or any building occupied requires a 911 physical location determined by where the driveway enters onto a road. (private or public)

This physical location of a number and street name will also now be your mailing address if you do not use a Post Office Box for your mail. Emergency Vehicles need a physical address.

All private roads with 2 or more property owners (including common driveways) must be named.

— NUMBER SIGNS —

May be VERTICAL or HORIZONTAL on Green Background with 4" White Numbers

- Read vertical numbers from top to bottom and horizontal numbers from left to right
- 1" space between numbers and at least ½ " border around the numbers
- Must be Reflective Material labeled as MUTCD (Manual on Uniform Traffic Control Devices-PennDOT)
- Background material choices are: aluminum, fiberglass, or non-corrosive metal in green color.
- Both sides of # sign must be numbered and visible from 50' in each direction.

---- WHERE TO PLACE YOUR NUMBER (#) SIGN ---

- If your mailbox is located on your driveway, the # sign may be attached to the mailbox, a bracket on the mailbox, or the post of the mailbox, but the number sign MUST BE 48" OFF the GROUND and UNDER 72" in HEIGHT.
- ➢ If your mailbox is not on your driveway, then a post to hold the number sign must be erected where your driveway enters the private or public road. The sign is then attached vertically or horizontally with bolts. STOP. If you pound your pole in too far underground lines could be hit. Use Call 1 if you plan to put your pole in deeper than 18" to avoid cable, telephone, & electric lines.
- > Posts must be on your property 6 to 8 ft. from the road pavement and not in township right-of-way
- > # sign posts may be wood or metal. Do not place # sign on fence, utility pole, stone, or tree.
- ➤ Apartment buildings have a # location at the main driveway; but separate apartment units must place their # sign above or to the right of their door.
- You have 1 year (June 27, 2012) to erect your # sign. (15 days to replace, if knocked down).
- Violation yields fine.

- STREET SIGNS —

- Private roads including shared driveways and development roads have until July 1, 2012 to purchase and erect their street signs. Future replacement of a sign is 15 days. Violation yields fine.
- New subdivisions must contact the township for street name approval
- Street Signs must be MUTCD (Manual on Uniform Traffic control Devices) reflectivity and placement.
- Private Street Signs are Blue Background with 6" White Letters ** Developments may choose a consistent different background color than blue, but must be MUTCD compliant.
- Street names must start with a CAPITAL letter (6") and continue with lower case letters.
- The sign face should be at least 8" in height on a 10 foot (break-away) pole.
- Use Call 1 if you are placing a new sign post to avoid underground lines & electrical dangers.
