Relocation Committee making a lot of progress

After months of revising / reviewing of appraisals from both Sound Transit and Eagles' appraisers, a settlement has been reached. Our attorney recently addressed the Relocation Committee and Grand Aerie on all the findings and it was determined the costs and risks of a trial outweighed the potential gain.

The settlement offer that was accepted is \$2.4 million which is roughly right in the middle of the two appraisals.

The Grand Aerie agent that was assigned to us during this process has already submitted the paperwork to get our Charter reinstated. Design and permitting is now in the works for the new facility with the intent to begin the remodel during the first or second week of the new year. Stay tuned!
