JULY AND AUGUST 2018

I am now in my chair writing about this month because it has been very hard on most all of us in my opinion.

Getting back from Dallas, Lady Diana and I were very tired. Stepping off that plane the heat was over 100, and tired as we were, we were pleased to see Rick Ream. His car was cool, and the ride home was wonderful. Now I had a day or two to rest up, but Diana had to go to work at 6 in the morning.

On Monday I started cleaning up the house. With all there was to do it took a few days. On about the 27th of July I was carrying many boxes to my storage room and a barbeque grate fell over on my foot. With only soft slippers on, my toe got smashed pretty bad. God it hurt. It would not stop bleeding. So, now Bobby could not do much because every time I would do anything it would start bleeding and hurt like hell. There were a lot of bandages to soak up the blood. I used gauze and duct tape, changing the bandages every four hours. It was hard to sleep at night. Every day for three weeks it was over 100, but the gauze worked. I did not have any bloody sheets. The air conditioner started not working well. There was a bad smell in the house. Looking all over the house I could not find anything. This went on for two weeks. Then I needed more gauze for my toe. I found a drawer in the bathroom that was filled with bandages. As I took out the bandages, at the back of the drawer I found the stink in the house. Yes Sir! A dead rat! There was creepy crawly stuff with flies. It was bad. After three days the smell was gone. On the 24th of July Lady Diana and I went to Bridgeport. The Aerie had trouble with MMS and dues cards, and the officers not knowing what to do. Diana took charge and helped the officers. As most of you know she is a whiz in the Wenatchee office. The air conditioner at Bridgeport was broken down and they had fans, but they did not help much. I told them if they would come down to my house in Wenatchee they could have one, as I had two extra. Becky the bartender said she would be down that night. It was getting dark when the two of us left Bridgeport. Both of us had not eaten and were in need of food. Now home and in bad shape the refrigerator was raided. I went to bed. Becky called about 11:30 and told Diana she was in town. Now it's rare for Diana to wake Bobby. I got up and dressed, went out to my storage house and got the air conditioner. Wow! That girl is on it. As I got the hand truck to the fence she drove up.

My own air conditioner in the heat pump started not working well. So, the house started getting hotter every day. So, I called Matt. He came over and jumped out the heat pump and it started to work. But it lasted only until he was out of sight. I had a smaller second air conditioner and I turned it on. It helped, but not enough. After three more days it was so hot in the house that about three in the morning there was a terrible smell. Bobby went looking and after about an hour in the pantry a can of crab had blown up. It was like a bomb had gone off. The top of the can was twisted, and almost bent in half. The bottom was still holding, but pushed down about an inch and the crab was gone. The stench was unbearable. After cleaning up the pantry the stench was still around. At five AM I went back to bed. The next morning I called Matt and told him Lady Diana said it was 101 in her room and about the canned crab can. This prompted Matt to come over. Poor Matt, it was 104 and he was putting in a TXV valve in the attic no less. It was hard on him, but I gave him lots of ice water. The house is cool now, the smell is about gone, and the weather is better.

My toe is not bleeding. It's not sore, and now I can wear socks. I will lose the nail.

It seems with hot weather there is always problems. Yesterday Diana and I went back to Bridgeport. On the way the car got hot. The engine was out of water. I stopped at a farm. Two nice girls gave us water for the car. It was bad. It took half an hour of pouring water in the radiator to cool it down. Where the water went I still don't know. The road was being grated and graveled and there was a long wait for the pilot car to lead us on a long graveled road with gravel flying everywhere. Disheveled we got to the Bridgeport Aerie. There are so many fires that the smoke never lets up. All the way there and all the way back, breathing was hard, and eyes were hurting.

John Noldan Grand Aerie Trustee

John Noldan, Grand Trustee of The Fraternal Order of Eagles, joined the organization in 1989 as a charter member of North Mason, Wash., #4226 and became the Aerie's first Worthy President.

In the years following, Brother Noldan held several other offices on the local level and served seven years as Worthy Secretary. He held every office on the state level on his way to being named Washington State Worthy President for the 2005-06 fraternal year. Brother Noldan was the State Membership Chairman three times and served on the Grand Aerie Pension board for 5 years.

In 2010, he was honored as an inductee into the Washington State Aerie Hall of Fame. Three years later, the membership voted Brother Noldan Grand Inside Guard for the 2013-14 term during the International Convention in Reno, Nev., 14-15 as Grand Conductor and 15-16 as Grand Aerie Chaplain He has been serving as a Grand Trustee from 2016 to present.

Brother Noldan is retired from the Department of Defense after 41 years of service. He and his wife Kat have four children and nine grandchildren.

He continues to work with Local Aeries and the State Aerie in various capacities and enjoys cruising with his Eagles brothers and sisters.
