Please read this letter at your next meeting and then pass it on to the member that is your charity chairman or Memorial Fund charity chairman.

My name is Gene Hansen, PSP/PGO and have been appointed by William Stotko, Pacific Northwest Regional President, as the Pacific Northwest Charity Chairman for the Memorial Foundation Fund. Our job, with your help, is to raise funds in support of the Memorial Fund. The Memorial Fund is the only Grand Aerie charity that directly supports the families of a member that loses his or her life in a job related accident.

The fund was started in 1944. It was designed primarily to assist surviving Eagle families of military members. It was later expanded to Eagle members serving as Police, Firemen, EMTs and their Volunteer units. It now covers all paid up Eagle Members killed in a work related accident and the benefits include medical, dental and educational benefits for the children up to \$30,000.00. The attached "History" of the Fund will explain the finer points of the program. The "Fund" also supports graduates of "Home on the Range" Boys and Girls school.

So, as you can see, the "Fund "its self cannot survive without donations to keep it solvent and with your help we can keep the Memorial Fund healthy. The way to do that is with fund raising activities such as dinners, meat raffles, craft shows or any other mechanism that comes to mind. When you have a successful program at your Aerie or Auxiliary, let me know about it and how it was done. Your idea may be of use to another Aerie or Auxiliary.

#### "Diabetic Socks for Veterans" Update

Our program 'Diabetic Socks for Veterans' is still running strong after five years. This year alone we have given out almost 2,000 pair, with about 12,000 total bought through the years (and many more donated). We did a giveaway in the lobby at the Portland VA hospital three times this year, along with doing PAD Awareness Days at both the Portland VA and for the first time at the Vancouver VA.

Michelle Goldschmidt with the VA informed us that our combined efforts have finally taken our status of having the highest amputation rate in America's VA's down to NUMBER TWO.

We got our first Table for Socks and information on foot care at the Veterans Day Parade along with a great interview with 'On the Go with Joe' (see KPTV link at bottom)

I've expanded to include American Legion Post 1, The Moose Lodge and the Lions Club as sponsors to our idea of Vet's helping Vets.

Our veteran Brothers in Yakama Washington have bought 500 pair and have been giving them out along with information on foot care at the Walla Walla VA.

I even got into the Movie 'Leave no Trace', a movie filmed here in Portland by Director Debra Granik. She has me in the movie at our 'Diabetic Socks for Veterans' table in a speaking part. This is available on Netflix. 100% of our donations go to buying socks.

We also have acupuncture for Vets and a friend of mine gives yoga instruction at the VA twice a week.
