CONTEST RULES FOR TALENT SCHOLARSHIP CONTEST

FunVention August 28-29, 2026

1. The contestant must be sponsored by an Aerie, Auxiliary, Past Presidents Club or an Eagle in Good Standing.
2. They will be judged on poise, appearance, in casual and formal attire.
3. They must present talent of their choice not to exceed five minutes. They must perform solo except they can use a CD, cassette tape, or an instrumental accompaniment.
4. They will be asked an impromptu question, the topic will be drawn from a hat.
5. The Aerie that is hosting the Fun Vention will select the judges.
6. Any contestant who has already won first place in the contest may not enter again.
7. Winners have 12 months to claim their scholarships or the money goes back into the fund for future contests.
8. The contestants must be between the ages of 16 & 22 years of age and at least a senior in High School, during the current high school year.
9. No scholarship awards will be paid directly to the contestants. Money will be sent to the school that the contestant will be or is attending. Contestant must provide the Aerie and Auxiliary secretaries with their school information (name & address) and their school ID#.
10. All money received for this program will be used for the same or earmarked for the next year's program
11. Contestants must be registered by August 20th on an application form along with the entry fee.
12. Contestants must be at the meeting Friday night before the contest for the drawing of order of appearance, interview and instructions for the contest.
13. Contestant's Saturday Banquet meal is free, parents are responsible for the cost of their own meals.
14. Sponsoring Aerie/Aux is responsible for informing contestants that they need money for other needed expenses.



Talent Scholarship Application

A copy of the Talent Scholarship Application should be sent to Bill Walton at 1828 Methow, Wenatchee, WA 98801 no later than August 20th.

The contestant must be sponsored by an Eagle's Past President's club, an Aerie or Auxiliary or any Eagle member in good standing.

Entry fee for the scholarship contest is \$150.

Contestants should be informed that their Saturday night banquet meal and their motel room (which is shared) are included in the entry fee. They will need money for other meals and expenses.

Generally the contestants go on some kind of outing Saturday, so they will want money for this.

The sponsor of the contestant may want to help pay for incidental expenses, such as other meals or outings or help with travel expenses.

Parents' expenses are not covered and they do not share a room with the contestant.
