A BLAST FROM THE PAST!

Here is a piece of trivia that most are not likely to remember but no doubt it's likely some of you will. This is a news article picture of THIS building from 1961 back when it was The Peter Rabbit Store on Wenatchee Avenue and it boasted "one stop shopping" as the new innovative way to shop. My how times have changed! The Eagles chapter #204 purchased this building in 2009 and began the renovations turning it into the club we have here today.



The Peter Rabbit store on North Wenatchee Avenue was a "one stop shopping" following a renovation in early 1961. The variety store, shop and deli was on the same roof as the supermarket. It had an expanded bakery, meat and produce department, an "air screen" beverage and dairy department and new fixtures.

This F.O.E. Chapter #204 was instituted on February 2, 1902

There were 9 initiates waiting to be sworn in that night and 21 more applications had been filed to join. Of the 9 that were sworn in that night almost all of them were appointed by the Grand Worthy President to some office as an interim officer until official elections could take place and the rest as they say - is history. When this chapter sold their building on 9th St. in 2006 the membership was at about 900 and the accommodations were too big and just too costly for their needs. When this current building became available it was purchased, renovated and we finally had a new Nest. Today this chapter has over 1,000 members!

And speaking of members... This year we honor one of our oldest members **Lillian Olson**.
She has been a member of the F.O.E. #204 for 75 years!
