FALL CONFERENCE IN JEOPARDY DUE TO CORONAVIRUS

The following is a document sent fro Fred Brattain to Mike Sionds on behalf of Longview/Kelso..

My Brothers; the Longview/Kelso Fall Conference 2020 planning committee has concluded that with the ongoing uncertainties of the ongoing corona virus pandemic they will be unable to properly prepare for a successful fall conference in October. With the constantly changing requirements for gatherings of more than 50 people making any planning a nightmare they are requesting the e-board consider cancelling the fall conference for 2020 and schedule the 2021 conference for October 1st, 2nd, 3rd 2021 to be held in Longview/Kelso. Their hope is to host the 2021 conference but felt that the option to allow another Aerie to host 2020 should be made available. WENATCHEE UPDATE

Hello to All Our Members and Friends!

We have missed you! As you may have heard Chelan and Douglas counties were okayed on June 11th, to move to Phase 1.5 and many of the restaurants and other businesses in town have been allowed to reopen. We are excited about the day we can open our doors once again, the reason for our delay is during the shut-down we had a mini flood in the building and currently the dance floor in the lounge is all torn up. We are hoping insurance will help cover it and luckily with the office still open it was caught sooner rather than later and did not cause as much damage as it could have.

Some other things that have changed since we closed:

- The memorial service for our members that have passed in the last year had to be postponed and rescheduled, we are unsure if we will be doing it later this year or will do two years worth at the memorial service in 2021. This will be discussed once we are able to get the Memorial Team together and figure it out.
- Our State Convention that was to be held in Yakima in June has been cancelled, the Grand Convention to be held in Spokane this year was moved to Reno, NV and the FunVention scheduled for Wenatchee in September was cancelled (the fundraising that supports this event occurs during the State Convention that was cancelled)
- The Eagle Valley Campground (Our Eagles only Campground located in CleElum) was unable to do prep work required to be open during the summer. They have just started to do clean and opening work so we will see when they will open
- Volunteers have been deep cleaning our Aerie home. Practicing social distancing and just a few at a time, they have been going through all of the cabinets and drawers, cleaning and reorganizing.
- We have been unable to do initiations, as a result some of our initiates time period to join has lapsed BUT Grand Aerie said any of those that lapsed during the shut down period can still be reinstated without having to pay the \$15.00 initiation fee again. They just need to come in to be initiated.
- We still continue to pay our mortgage, insurance, lights, water, etc. and while it has been a strain we have been applying for small business loans to help us out.

- Remember the Aerie office is open Monday – Friday from 8-12

We are shooting for opening on Monday (6/22) about 2pm

The next Aerie Meeting will be Wednesday July 1st

We are working on bringing in BINGO with slide cards...We have applied for the proper licenses and will share more information as we figure it out

The Auxiliary is still doing their fireworks stand in the East Wenatchee Grocery Outlet parking lot. If you would like to volunteer, Text Windy at 509-421-1223 or email foeaux204@hotmail.com. William "Bill" Stotko Grand Aerie Outside Guard

Bill Stotko, Grand Worthy Inside Guard, joined the Fraternal Order of Eagles in September of 1977, joining the Monroe Eagles #2327 in Monroe Washington. He quickly became involved in the Fraternal side of the Fraternal order of Eagles, working his way through the Officer chairs of his home Aerie. Although Brother Bill was a Truck Driver by trade, he could always be depended on to step up when assistance was needed in maintaining his home Aerie.

Brother Bill became President of Monroe Aerie in 1997 – 1998 after working his way up through the chairs. Brother Bill has also held the position of Aerie President. Bill eventually had to transfer to Everett Aerie 13, in Everett Washington, following the closure of his home Aerie. Since his transfer to Everett Aerie #13, Brother Bill has the positions of Aerie President and Aerie Trustee as well as the Aerie Secretary. Brother Bill has held the position of Aerie Secretary, for 7 Eagles years in both the Monroe Eagles as well as the Everett Eagles. Currently, Brother Bill is once again filling the position of Aerie Secretary.

Brother Bill became the Washington State Aerie President during the 2010 – 2011 Eagle year after working his way up through the chairs beginning his journey at the Trustee level in 2001 - 2002. During this period, Brother Bill was also very involved in the initial development of the Washington State Aerie training program, being a part of the original group that put the training program together. Much of the training program was later adopted by the Grand Aerie in the development of the Grand Aerie Training program.

Brother Bill was selected from among all the Past State Presidents of Washington State to be the Pacific Northwest Reginal President for the Eagle year 2018 – 2019.

During this same period of time, Brother Bill has also been very active in working with Aeries in difficulty throughout the United States. Brother Bill's knowledge of the Grand Aerie Statutes as well as his respect for members rights, has given him the ability, working with these distressed Eagle Aeries and Auxiliaries, to bring them back into full compliance with our order.

Brother Bill has filled the position of Grand Aerie Elections Chairman for the last several years, being instrument in converting the election counting process into an electronic process that is able to tabulate the election count and provide results in hours rather than the days that it used to take. This same process was later adopted by the Grand Auxiliary as well.

Brother Bill and his wife Carey have been married for 33 years and have three children, Philip, Patricia, and Theresa. Additionally, Brother Bill and Sister Carey have seven Grand Children.

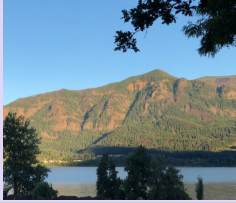

Summary of Phase 3 Social Room Rules

Below is a summary of Phase 3 rules to keep everyone safe. Please note these rules are subject to change as required by the State of Washington and as deemed appropriate by the Board of Trustees.

Social Distancing:

We are only allowed to have 75% capacity (including our outdoor seating area) until we reach Phase 4, which translates to 93 patrons and staff allowed in the Aerie at one time. This means members in good standing, new members awaiting initiation, and spouses of members will be allowed in. No guests will be allowed until we reach Phase 4 at which time we will reevaluate.

Only 10 people may be at a table.

Patrons and employees must maintain minimum six-foot separation between employees and members.

Patrons must follow social distancing markers that denote six-foot spacing in commonly used areas.

We have reduced the number of tables in the Social Room, and there will be outside seating and tables.

Moving tables and adding more than 10 chairs to a table is not allowed.

Patrons cannot linger at the bar. Patrons should wait to be called up to order and then return to your seat.

The smoke shack will not be open without the garage door open.

Cleaning, Disinfecting, and Hygiene:

Staff will disinfect the tables after patrons leave the table for the day.

We will use plastic glassware for single use only, and we will not provide straws. Patrons are welcome to bring their own reusable straws.

When getting refills of your beverages, patrons must throw away their plastic cup and not hand their personal, reusable straw to the bartenders.

Bartenders and patrons must wash their hands often and use hand sanitizer which will be placed throughout the Aerie and on the bar.

Masks:

Washington requires the use of face coverings by every employee unless they are working alone.

According to Washington's new rule, people must wear face coverings in public indoors, as well as outdoors if six feet of social distancing can't be maintained. One exception to keeping a face mask on would be when actively eating and drinking inside a restaurant. But the masks would need to be worn in most other situations, such as walking around common areas, going to the bathroom, and interacting with staff." that we strongly encourage patrons to wear masks as well.

Gambling:

We are halting Queen of Hearts and the Quarter/Dollar Roll during Phase 3 and will reevaluate at Phase 4.

Pull tabs will be available for purchase, but members can not open them at the bar. Members must open them at a table inside the building. Our gambling license does not allow members to open the pull tabs outside.

Food:

The kitchen will be open with the regular menu.

Friday night dinners, taco night, and soups are on hold until Phase 4 and Sunday Breakfast is done for the season.

Karaoke:

Karaoke is on hold until Phase 4, and we will reevaluate.

Members Behavior and Adherence to the Rules:

We ask that members be patient with us as this is an unprecedented situation. We are learning as we go and dealing with changing rules and policies regarding the health and safety for all.

We recognize these rules are new and not what we have come to expect. However, patrons must follow these rules, and the bartenders are required to enforce them with the full support of the Board of Trustees and Aerie Officers. We will ask patrons to leave if they are not able to follow the rules.

If members have questions or concerns about the rules, they should contact a Trustee or come to a Trustee meeting. We ask that you treat bartenders respectfully since they are not creating the rules, but are being asked to enforce the rules.

Members should not come to the Aerie if they are feeling ill or run down. Everyone needs to do their part to keep the Aerie open and safe for all.
