RENO CONVENTION 2020 THE TRIP HOME

Friday morning Diana and I went to Mel's Diner for breakfast. Steak and eggs were \$8.99, and I had been looking forward to it. Most mornings we would eat at Rosey's in the Casino. There were large lines, and it was always a long wait. The food was always good, and this always meant that it was a rush to get to the meeting on time. This day, it was empty the room of our belongings and the Bellboy had been called and off I went to get the car, get gas and off to Mel's. My God! There were hundreds of young firemen in the hotel on this day. There had been many for three days, but today there were firemen everywhere. (They were fighting the fires in Susanville.) The smoke had gotten thicker each day. There was lots of ash on the car. I drove to the front door and there was Diana and the bellboy with all the bags. I have got to admit that car can handle a lot of luggage!

Diana wanted her coffee, but there were no coffee houses on the way out of town and Dutch Brothers was the other direction. It was slow going as there were firetrucks coming and going in each direction and no way to pass. The smoke was so thick that no one could pass any way and Diana was hopeing for that coffee. At the Nevada Border we stopped at a place called Boom Town. Diana's leg was hurting already, and there was no coffee. The Juniper trees were everywhere. It would have been a beautiful drive; the scenery was good for what one could see. The smoke was even worse in California and the firetrucks were bumper to bumper both ways. As we got close to Susanville there were lots of old cars and trucks. You know that I like that. Diana on the other hand told Bobby no more old cars. Her leg did not make it any better. At Susanville, the road was closed due to the fires, that meant a back tract of thirty miles and on a county road for a way, then it was back to Alturus. This made Diand better as there is a nice coffee house and a gas station. There was now Highway 299 to climb, then 139 to Newell Falls, and them 39 to Highway 140 at Klamath Falls, and from there to Highway 97. Klamath was evacuated so no stop. We had gotten gas at Newell, and Diana was mad at the world so no lunch! I got some chicken at a gas station. As most of you know 97 is straight as a string, a nice two-lane great highway. I stopped and got some of those nice red chipped rocks for Diana for her BBQ because she needed some, and of course she threw a fit. Something about it being illegal. But now the BBQ is a lot better. That leg was swelled and was hurting her a lot. She wanted to stop at Bend for the night. So, about four PM Diana got a room. She was in pain and now needed to eat, YEAH! There was a Sherri's and we got a good supper. I was tired and Diana was tired and in pain. Bedtime came early. There were two bedrooms and the bathroom was extremely small. Diana was upset with herself. She had left her nightgown hanging on the door in the bathroom at the hotel in Reno. The thing was given her by an old friend that has long passed. Even though it was threadbare it still hurt her to lose it. Diana was in a lot pain. By midnight, the leg was swollen, and she had little hope of walking. The bathroom trips were an adventure. By 2 AM she was crying in pain. By 4 AM I could not take it any more and I begged her to go to the hospital. But no was all she would say, that if she was going to die, she wanted to be at home. I thought it must be blood clots and the two of us were worried. So, I got her to the car, took everything out of the motel room and we left. We passed a Dutch Brothers and stopped for coffee but no breakfast. I was shocked that so many people had moved to bend and the surrounding area. I just could not believe it. We got gas at the border. Diana wanted to stop a Mary Hill, the Stonehenge Memorial, then she did not want to stop! I took her there anyway. She could not get out of the car, so I took pictures. She loved them. I bet she felt better even if she would not admit it. There was no complaining as most of the drive was at about 80 mph, getting home at 11:30 AM.

Herman and Hansel the Doxies lifted her spirits and she laid down for a while then it was off to the hospital. I thank God and so does she that it was not blood clots, but still a bad thing. She had a bad case of Cellulitis. It was a long time before she could walk without terrible pain.

Since we got home, she has had another surgery on her leg and she still has lots of swelling and it still is not fixed. Yet she is much better even if she does not say so. After the surgery she was black and blue from her stomach to her knees. She will be seeing the doctor again soon.

Diana is still taking care of 204 even while she is in pain. (I will add that yes, I am still in pain and Bobby has been a real trooper. I thank the good Lord for him every day, even though he "drives me crazy". I know, I know "short trip. diana)

Greeting my Brothers and Sisters. As we prepare to venture into that season called fall or autumn or simply the season that is absolutely beautiful, full of changes and starts to rain. It is still probably my favorite part of the year. Net gain at the beginning of September was a minus 15.71%, meaning we are down 5639 aerie members. The auxiliary is down 2268 or 11.68% for a total of minus 7907 aerie and auxiliary members or 14.29%. In order for Washington to make net gain by next May we need to bring in 152 new or re-enrolled members a week. Right now we have 375 waiting for initiation on the aerie side and 55 waiting to be re-enrolled. Because the virus restrictions have really slowed down business as usual is not a reason to back off. If we get complacent and figure we can deal with any problems after the smoke clears we may just find ourselves with nothing left to deal with. Get those new members signed up and your aeries and auxiliaries can "innovate" to get them on the rolls. Take heart brothers and sisters, we will persevere and come out of this better than when we went in. Your state officers have been busy during these trying times with programs to help troubled aeries and auxiliaries and we are ramping up the officer training programs throughout the state. Well now would be a good time to close. I am looking forward to the end of Bobby's story of his trip to Reno. Thanks for taking the time to read your newsletter and thanks to Brother Leonard Blakely for all the work he does putting it together. Take care out there and rest assured your state officers will keep the light on the F.O.E.

William "Bill" Stotko Grand Aerie Conductor

Bill Stotko, Grand Worthy Conductor, joined the Fraternal Order of Eagles in September of 1977, joining the Monroe Eagles #2327 in Monroe Washington. He quickly became involved in the Fraternal side of the Fraternal order of Eagles, working his way through the Officer chairs of his home Aerie. Although Brother Bill was a Truck Driver by trade, he could always be depended on to step up when assistance was needed in maintaining his home Aerie.

Brother Bill became President of Monroe Aerie in 1997 – 1998 after working his way up through the chairs. Brother Bill has also held the position of Aerie President. Bill eventually had to transfer to Everett Aerie 13, in Everett Washington, following the closure of his home Aerie. Since his transfer to Everett Aerie #13, Brother Bill has the positions of Aerie President and Aerie Trustee as well as the Aerie Secretary. Brother Bill has held the position of Aerie Secretary, for 7 Eagles years in both the Monroe Eagles as well as the Everett Eagles. Currently, Brother Bill is once again filling the position of Aerie Secretary.

Brother Bill became the Washington State Aerie President during the 2010 – 2011 Eagle year after working his way up through the chairs beginning his journey at the Trustee level in 2001 - 2002. During this period, Brother Bill was also very involved in the initial development of the Washington State Aerie training program, being a part of the original group that put the training program together. Much of the training program was later adopted by the Grand Aerie in the development of the Grand Aerie Training program.

Brother Bill was selected from among all the Past State Presidents of Washington State to be the Pacific Northwest Reginal President for the Eagle year 2018 – 2019.

During this same period of time, Brother Bill has also been very active in working with Aeries in difficulty throughout the United States. Brother Bill's knowledge of the Grand Aerie Statutes as well as his respect for members rights, has given him the ability, working with these distressed Eagle Aeries and Auxiliaries, to bring them back into full compliance with our order.

Brother Bill has filled the position of Grand Aerie Elections Chairman for the last several years, being instrument in converting the election counting process into an electronic process that is able to tabulate the election count and provide results in hours rather than the days that it used to take. This same process was later adopted by the Grand Auxiliary as well.

Brother Bill and his wife Carey have been married for 33 years and have three children, Philip, Patricia, and Theresa. Additionally, Brother Bill and Sister Carey have seven Grand Children.
